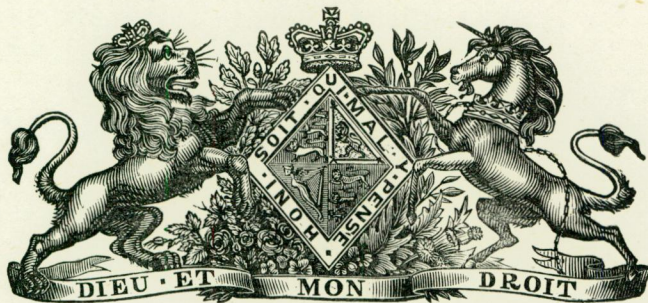

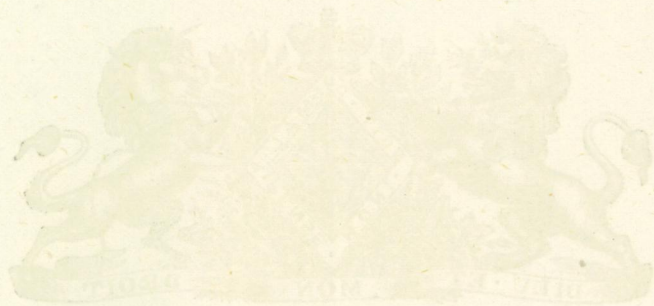
BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. From and after the commencement of this Act so much of the fourth section of the "Oysters Fisheries Act of 1884" as requires that all leases granted under the said section shall be held subject to the payment of a royalty to Her Majesty of three shillings per bag containing not more than three bushels of oysters, shall be repealed. And from the said time all such leases shall be read as if every covenant, agreement, or provision for the payment of the said royalty therein contained, were cancelled; and as if every liability in connection with such royalty had ceased and determined. But nothing in this Act shall affect the past operation of the said section or any liability incurred or thing lawfully done thereunder before the commencement of this Act.

From and after the commencement of this Act so much of the fourth section of the "Oysters (Royalty) Act of 1887" as requires that all leases granted under the said section shall be held subject to the payment of a royalty to the holder of such lease, shall be repealed, and from the said date all such leases shall be read as if every covenant, agreement or condition in the said section and every other provision contained therein were omitted; and all such leases shall be read as if every such covenant, agreement or condition and every other provision in the Act shall affect the past operation of the said section or any liability incurred or thing lawfully done thereunder before the commencement of this Act.

1. From and after the commencement of this Act so much of the fourth section of the "Oysters, &c. Act of 1851," as requires that all leases granted under the said section shall be held subject to the payment of a royalty to the Majesty of three shillings per bar containing not more than three bushels of oysters, shall be repealed. And from the said time all such leases shall be held as if every covenant, agreement, or proviso for the payment of the said royalty therein contained, were cancelled; and as if every proviso in connection with such royalty had ceased and determined, the royalty in this Act shall affect the said leases of the said oysters, or any liability incurred or thing lawfully done thereunder, before the commencement of this Act.

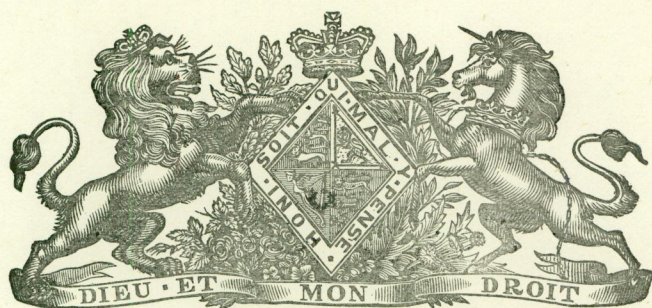

ARTICLE

As amended by the Senate of Victoria University, 1950.

5. To elect and re-elect the members of the Senate of the University of Queensland.

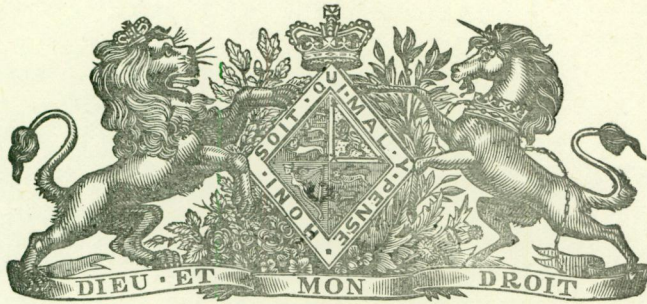
6. To elect and re-elect the members of the Senate of the University of Western Australia.

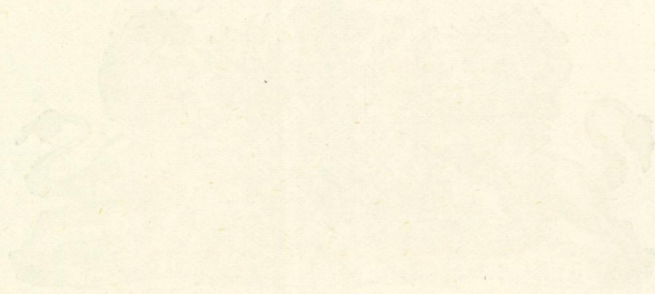

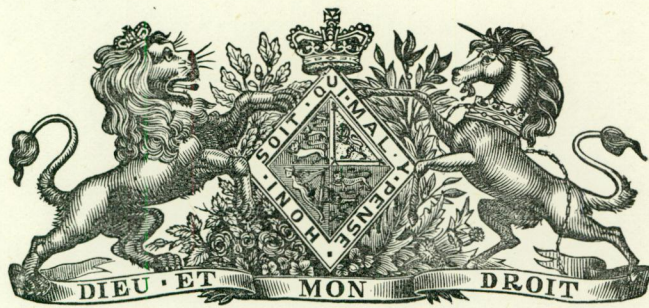
