This Private Bill originated in the Legislative Council, and, having this day passed, is now ready for presentation to the Legislative Assembly for its concurrence.

An Act for the administration of the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund.

WHEREAS an explosion occurred in the Bulli Coal-mine, at Bulli, Preamble. in the Colony of New South Wales, in the month of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, by which a large number of persons lost their lives. And whereas a 5 large sum of money has been raised by public subscription with a view of affording pecuniary relief to the widows, orphans, and others left destitute by that disaster. And whereas the said sum of money (known as the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund) is administered under the direction of a Committee, known as the Bulli Disaster Fund Executive 10 Committee, and consisting of the following gentlemen, namely, His Worship the Mayor, the Honorable F. Abigail, Honorable J. Macintosh, Honorable G. A. Lloyd, the Mayor of Parramatta, the Mayor of Burwood, the Mayor of Darlington, Alderman Meeks, Alderman Beare, T. M. Slattery, E. C. Batt, W. C. Willis, the Honorary Treasurers, A. J. Riley, 15 Esq., M.L.A., G. Durham, the Honorary Secretaries, E. J. H. Knapp c 5—A

and G. Hamilton, the Mayor of Melbourne, the Mayor of Wollongong, C. H. Hannell, T. W. Garlick, Henry Fry, and James Hunt. And whereas the said sum of money was chiefly deposited at interest in several of the public banks of the Colony of New South Wales, in

5 order that the same might be applied to the purposes aforesaid, in such manner as the said Committee should direct. And whereas the sum of Thirty-six thousand one hundred and seventy-four pounds one shilling and seven pence, being a portion of the said sum of money, remained

on the thirtieth day of September now last passed in the said several 10 banks unexpended. And whereas the said Committee have agreed to a scheme for the distribution of the said sum of Thirty-six thousand one hundred and seventy-four pounds one shilling and seven pence, and of the income to be derived therefrom, which said scheme, subject to the several payments made out of the said fund since the thirtieth day

15 of September last, is set forth in the Schedule to this Act. And whereas the persons forming the said Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund Executive Committee are anxious to be relieved from the duties and obligations imposed on them in connection with the management and control of the said moneys. And whereas it is expedient that they

20 should therefore be relieved therefrom, and that trustees should be appointed and provision be made for enforcing the conditions on which such moneys have been allotted, and for the proper and legal

management of the said fund. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent 25 of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. This Act may for all purposes be cited as the "Bulli Colliery Short title. Disaster Fund Act, 1888.'

2. The following gentlemen shall be the first trustees of the Appointment of said Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund, namely, William Cain of Melbourne, Alban Joseph Riley of Sydney, Henry Buchanan of Newcastle, and William J. Poulter of Wollongong, the Honorable George Alfred Lloyd, M.L.C., the Honorable John Macintosh, M.L.C., John Meeks,

35 one of the Aldermen of the city of Sydney; and the word "trustees" hereinafter used, shall mean and signify the said first trustees and the substituted trustees who may from time to time be appointed trustees under the provisions hereinafter contained.

3. As soon as conveniently may be after the passing of this Official trustees to be 40 Act, a meeting of the trustees named in the last preceding section chosen. shall be summoned by Alban Joseph Riley, or in the event of his absence by the Honorable George Alfred Lloyd, for the purpose of electing official trustees. Not less than ten days' notice of such meeting shall be given in writing to each of the trustees, and at such

45 meeting three persons shall form a quorum. At such meeting the trustees voting either in person or by proxy shall elect two of the trustees to be official trustees of the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund, and shall also elect a chairman.

4. The names of the said official trustees shall be registered in Names to be 50 the office of the Registrar General free of charge, and whenever any registered. vacancy shall occur in their number, then upon the filling up of such vacancy under the power hereinafter contained, the name of such new trustee shall, in like manner, be registered in the said office, and any lands at that time vested in the said official trustees as mortgagees, and 55 all other investments shall thereupon pass, go to, and be held by, the continuing official trustees, if any, and the substituted official trustee

or trustees, by virtue of such registration alone, without any conveyance or assignment. 5.

5. The official trustees shall act under, and carry out, any official trustees to be resolution of the trustees passed at a meeting of the trustees affecting under control of the said investments, and shell transfer change all trustees. the said investments, and shall transfer, change, alter, and vary the same as the trustees may from time to time direct. In the event of 5 any official trustee refusing to obey such directions, the trustees may, by resolution passed at any of their meetings, remove such official trustee and appoint another in his place, under the power of appointing new trustees hereinafter contained.

6. Anything by this Act authorized to be done by the trustees Quorum and 10 may be done by any three of such trustees at any meeting of the appointment of trustees duly convened, under the regulations or bye-laws to be made under the power for that purpose hereinafter contained. The chairman of the trustees, shall, if present, preside at their meetings, and if he be not present at such meeting, then such other trustee as the trustees 15 present at such meeting shall choose shall preside thereat.

trustee presiding at any meeting of the trustees shall, in the event of an equal division of votes at such meeting, have a second or casting vote. The trustees may, from time to time, appoint a secretary and such other officers and employés as they shall think fit, and may

20 remove any persons so appointed, and they may pay such secretary, officers, and employés such salaries and remuneration as they think fit; but under no circumstances shall the cost of managing and administering the said fund exceed the sum of two hundred pounds

25 7. All moneys raised by public subscription for the relief of the Moneys vested in sufferers by the accident which occurred in the Bulli Coal-mine afore-trustees. said, and forming the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund, and which at the time of the passing of this Act remain unexpended and are under the control of the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund Executive Committee, and 30 all lands and hereditaments held as security by way of mortgage for moneys advanced by the said trustees, are hereby vested in the said official trustees, subject nevertheless to the control of the trustees, and the said official trustees and their successors in office shall hold such moneys, lands, and hereditaments, and all securities for moneys here-

35 after advanced by the trustees, and all investments authorized by this Act for the purposes of the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund, subject to the

control of the trustees.

8. All moneys vested in the official trustees by this Act shall The Mining Accident form, subject to the provisions herein contained, a fund under the Relief Fund. 40 name of the "Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund," hereinafter referred to as the "fund." All future subscriptions, donations, grants, and bequests to the fund, and all other moneys whatsoever from time to time received by the trustees in virtue of their office shall from time to time be invested in the names of the official trustees, and all such subscriptions, 45 donations, grants, and bequests shall form part of the capital moneys

of the fund, and be applied and distributed under the provisions of this Act.

9. All moneys forming part of the fund may be invested in Investment of fund. New South Wales Government Debentures or New South Wales 50 Government Inscribed Stock, or may be placed on deposit in any bank in Sydney incorporated by Act of Parliament or Royal Charter, in amounts not exceeding ten thousand pounds in any one bank, or may be lent on first mortgages of freehold lands, tenements, and hereditaments in the city of Sydney, or within ten miles thereof, and the 55 said investments may from time to time be altered and varied at the discretion of the trustees.

10. The fund and the income derivable therefrom shall from Application of time to time be applied first in defraying all proper and reasonable income. costs, charges, and expenses of preparing and passing this Act, and

then of controlling, managing, and administering the fund, and carrying this Act into effect, such latter expenses however not to exceed the sum of two hundred pounds per annum, and then in making payments to the persons named in and in accordance with 5 the provisions of the Schedule hereto. Provided nevertheless that if at any time it shall appear necessary for the trustees to make any special exception in favour of paying any of the parties named in the said Schedule, or that may hereafter be proved to be in need of relief, a lump sum in satisfaction of any such relief, it shall be lawful for, 10 but not compulsory upon the trustees by special resolution duly passed at a meeting of the trustees, to make such payment in full, and

thereupon and thereafter any person receiving such allowance shall have no further payment made to him or her, or have any claim whatever upon the fund. And all payments in the nature of a lump sum 15 that shall have been heretofore made by the said Executive Committee shall be deemed in full satisfaction of his or her interest in the fund.

11. In order that a complete and final distribution and winding Triennial adjustup of the fund may be effected, it shall be lawful for the trustees, ment of fund. and they are hereby empowered once in every three years, dating from 20 the said thirtieth day of September now last past, to hold a special meeting of the trustees, at which meeting the state of the fund shall be considered and the plan for the distribution of the same may be readjusted and the relief to be afforded to the said sufferers may be increased, diminished, or extended, and the Schedule hereto be altered

25 accordingly as the state of the fund and then existing circumstances may require, and as to the trustees may seem expedient.

12. Any resolution so altering the said Schedule shall be passed Resolutions altering

by the majority of the trustees present at such meeting and shall be Schedule to be registered. entered upon the proceedings of the meetings of the trustees, and a 30 copy of the resolution of the trustees signed by the chairman of the said meeting shall be registered in the office of the Registrar-General free of charge, and shall also be published once in the Government Gazette.

13. No fresh or new applications for relief shall be entertained No fresh claims for 35 by the trustees after the thirtieth day of September, one thousand relief after 30th September 1890. eight hundred and ninety.

14. It shall be lawful for but not imperative upon the trustees Power to purchase at any time and from time to time after the said thirtieth day of annuities September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and after any 40 resolution passed by the majority of the trustees at a meeting called for that purpose, to purchase an annuity or annuities to be paid and payable to such person or persons as they shall think fit, who shall, on the said thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, be recipients of relief from the fund, and such annuities 45 if so purchased shall be terminable at the times corresponding to the

periods when the sums mentioned in the Schedule hereunder written shall cease to be payable, and shall be a full and absolute payment in satisfaction of any relief granted by the trustees, and thereafter no such annuitant shall be entitled to any further payment whatever . 50 from the fund.

15. The official trustees of the fund may institute or defend Actions and suits. any action or suit relative to any securities taken by the trustees in the names of the said official trustees for the purposes of the fund, and may, by the direction of the trustees, institute, prose-55 cute, or abandon any suit or action, civil or criminal, that may at any time become or be considered necessary for the protection, recovery, or due administration of the fund, or the investments thereof, and may defend any action or suit in respect thereof, and in every such action, suit, or proceeding, they may be styled the official

trustees of the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund, without more, and any such action, suit, or proceeding, shall not be affected by any change in the persons for the time being holding the position of official trustees. All expenses incurred by the said official trustees in any such action or 5 suit shall be a charge upon the fund.

16. In all deeds or other instruments the official trustees of the Style of official said Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund may be so styled without the names trustees in deeds, &c.

or name of them, or any of them, being expressed.

17. The accounts of the trustees for the year ending on the Audit of accounts.

10 thirtieth day of September, in each year, shall be audited by such persons and in such manner as the trustees may from time to time direct.

18. The trustees shall in each and every year, as soon as the Statement of receipts yearly audit of their accounts is complete, cause to be prepared a and expenditure to 15 statement, to be signed by the chairman of the trustees for the time

being, of all moneys received and expended by them, and the same shall be published once in the Government Gazette.

19. If any person named in the Schedule hereto, whether of Persons named in full age or a minor shall, whilst entitled to any payment from the possessed of means 20 fund, become possessed of any means of support from any other source of support. other than his or her own earnings, the trustees shall reduce the amount of such payments, or may cease to make any such payments to such person. The trustees, notwithstanding that they have previously reduced the amount of, or ceased to make any such payments as aforesaid to any person, may increase the amount of such payment to the amount which would be payable and at the such payment.

to the amount which would be payable under the provisions of the said Schedule, or to any smaller amount, or may where any such payments have been wholly discontinued by them, again make such payments as may be authorized by the provisions of the said Schedule.

30 If any person named in the said Schedule be in the receipt of relief from, or become an inmate of any charitable institution (except on account of temporary illness or temporary bodily infirmity), such person shall cease to be entitled to receive any payments from the fund. If any person named in the said Schedule shall dispose of,

35 transfer, anticipate, or assign his or her interest in any moneys coming to him or her from the fund, or attempt so to do, all payments there-

from, to or on behalf of such person, shall thereupon cease.

20. Every agreement made by any trustees or officers to pay Misappropriation of any money out of the fund, except as herein provided, shall be null moneys.

40 and void, and any trustee or other officer making such agreement, or paying any moneys out of the fund contrary to the provisions of this Act, shall immediately cease to be a trustee, and shall be removed from the office of trustee, and a new trustee shall be appointed in his place.

21. If the trustees hereby constituted, or any of them, or any Power to appoint trustees or trustee to be appointed as hereinafter provided, or by any new trustees. Court of competent jurisdiction, including any official trustee or trustees, shall die, or go to reside abroad, or desire to be discharged, or refuse or become incapable to act in the trusts hereof, or be removed

50 as hereinbefore mentioned, the remaining trustees shall at a meeting to be duly convened for that purpose, within fourteen days of the occurrence of the vacancy, appoint some fit and proper person or persons residing in the Colony of New South Wales to be a new trustee or trustees or new official trustee or trustees, as the case may be, in

55 the place of the trustee or trustees so dying or going to reside abroad, or desiring to be discharged, or refusing or becoming incapable to act, or being removed as aforesaid. Provided always that no appointment of a new trustee or trustees shall be deemed invalid because it shall not have been made within the time hereinbefore limited for the exercise

exercise of the power of appointing new trustees. Provided also that an entry made in the minute book of the meetings of the trustees and duly registered as aforesaid, of the appointment of any person or persons to be new trustee or trustees, or new official trustee or trustees, 5 and purporting to be signed by the chairman at the meeting at which such appointment purports to have been made, shall be conclusive evidence of such appointment, and such appointment shall not afterwards be disputed on any ground whatsoever.

22. The receipt and receipts in writing of the trustees or the Trustees' receipts. 10 official trustees, for any moneys paid to them by any person, shall be sufficient discharge to such person, and he shall not be bound to enquire into the right of the said official or other trustees to receive the same, nor be answerable for any misapplication or nonapplication

thereof.

23. The trustees or trustee, official trustees or official trustee Indemnity to for the time being of this Act, shall be respectively chargeable only for trustees. 15 such moneys, stocks, funds, and securities as they shall respectively actually receive, notwithstanding their respectively signing any receipt for the sake of conformity, and shall be answerable and accountable 20 only for their own acts, receipts, neglects, defaults, and not for those of each other, nor for any banker, broker, or other person with whom any moneys or securities belonging to the said fund may be deposited, nor

for the insufficiency or deficiency of any stocks, funds, or securities, nor for any other loss, unless the same shall happen through their own

25 wilful default respectively.

24. The trustees shall have power from time to time to make, Power to make rules alter, and repeal regulations and by-laws not inconsistent with and regulations. the provisions of this Act, for regulating their proceedings and the conduct of their business, for regulating the duties of their officers and 30 employés, and for taking security for the due and faithful performance of their duty by such officers and employés, and generally for carrying out the provisions of this Act.

SCHEDULE.

A QUARTERLY allowance of the sum of money set opposite the name of each person shall be paid to such person by the trustees, on the thirty-first day of December, the thirty-first day of March, the thirtieth day of June, and the thirtieth day of September in each year, or so soon thereafter as conveniently can be, but such payments shall cease in all cases where an appoint way he purchased under the provisions in the Act. in all cases where an annuity may be purchased under the provisions in the Act.

The persons hereinafter described as widows shall be entitled to such allowances

The persons hereinafter described as widows shall be entitled to such allowances respectively, so long as they remain widows, chaste, and of good repute.

If any widow shall again marry, the trustees shall pay her a sum of one hundred pounds, when all further claim by her upon the fund shall cease, but should any widow at the time of marriage be an annuitant, this provision shall be considered as satisfied.

The persons hereinafter described as boys shall receive their allowances respectively, until they attain the age of fifteen years, or become annuitants.

The persons hereinafter described as girls shall receive their allowances respectively, until they attain the age of fifteen years, or become annuitants.

The boys and girls hereinafter mentioned shall, for the purposes of this Act, be taken to have attained the ages set opposite their names on the thirtieth September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the case of any described as under

50 thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the case of any described as under one year shall be taken to have attained the age of one year on the thirtieth September,

one year shall be taken to have attained the age of one year on the thirtieth September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

Should any person or persons, other than those hereinafter mentioned, within the period of three years from the thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, make any application to the trustees for relief out of the fund, the trustees may entertain such application, and may grant such relief as they, under the circumstances proved to them, may think fit, or may refuse such relief.

The provisions of this Schedule shall be read and construed as though the same took effect on the thirtieth September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

An Act for the administration of the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund.

WHEREAS an explosion occurred in the Bulli Coal-mine, at Bulli, Preamble. in the Colony of New South Wales, in the month of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, by which a large number of persons lost their lives. And whereas a large sum of money has been raised by public subscription with a view of affording pecuniary relief to the widows, orphans, and others left destitute by that disaster. And whereas the said sum of money (known as the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund) is administered under the direction of a Committee, known as the Bulli Disaster Fund Executive 10 Committee, and consisting of the following gentlemen, namely, His Worship the Mayor, the Honorable F. Abigail, Honorable J. Macintosh, Honorable G. A. Lloyd, the Mayor of Parramatta, the Mayor of Burwood, the Mayor of Darlington, Alderman Meeks, Alderman Beare, T. M. Slattery, E. C. Batt, W. C. Willis, the Honorary Treasurers, A. J. Riley, 15 Esq., M.L.A., G. Durham, the Honorary Secretaries, E. J. H. Knapp of 5—A

and G. Hamilton, the Mayor of Melbourne, the Mayor of Wollongong, C. H. Hannell, T. W. Garlick, Henry Fry, and James Hunt. And whereas the said sum of money was chiefly deposited at interest in several of the public banks of the Colony of New South Wales, in

5 order that the same might be applied to the purposes aforesaid, in such manner as the said Committee should direct. And whereas the sum of Thirty-six thousand one hundred and seventy-four pounds one shilling and seven pence, being a portion of the said sum of money, remained on the thirtieth day of September now last passed in the said several

10 banks unexpended. And whereas the said Committee have agreed to a scheme for the distribution of the said sum of Thirty-six thousand one hundred and seventy-four pounds one shilling and seven pence, and of the income to be derived therefrom, which said scheme, subject to the several payments made out of the said fund since the thirtieth day

15 of September last, is set forth in the Schedule to this Act. And whereas the persons forming the said Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund Executive Committee are anxious to be relieved from the duties and obligations imposed on them in connection with the management and

control of the said moneys. And whereas it is expedient that they 20 should therefore be relieved therefrom, and that trustees should be appointed and provision be made for enforcing the conditions on which such moneys have been allotted, and for the proper and legal management of the said fund. Be it therefore enacted by the

Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent 25 of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. This Act may for all purposes be cited as the "Bulli Colliery Short title. Disaster Fund Act, 1888."

2. The following gentlemen shall be the first trustees of the Appointment of said Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund, namely, William Cain of Melbourne, Alban Joseph Riley of Sydney, Henry Buchanan of Newcastle, and William J. Poulter of Wollongong, the Honorable George Alfred Lloyd, M.L.C., the Honorable John Macintosh, M.L.C., John Meeks,

35 one of the Aldermen of the city of Sydney; and the word "trustees" hereinafter used, shall mean and signify the said first trustees and the substituted trustees who may from time to time be appointed trustees under the provisions hereinafter contained.

3. As soon as conveniently may be after the passing of this Official trustees to be 40 Act, a meeting of the trustees named in the last preceding section chosen. shall be summoned by Alban Joseph Riley, or in the event of his

absence by the Honorable George Alfred Lloyd, for the purpose of electing official trustees. Not less than ten days' notice of such meeting shall be given in writing to each of the trustees, and at such

45 meeting three persons shall form a quorum. At such meeting the trustees voting either in person or by proxy shall elect two of the trustees to be official trustees of the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund, and shall also elect a chairman.

4. The names of the said official trustees shall be registered in Names to be 50 the office of the Registrar General free of charge, and whenever any registered. vacancy shall occur in their number, then upon the filling up of such vacancy under the power hereinafter contained, the name of such new trustee shall, in like manner, be registered in the said office, and any lands at that time vested in the said official trustees as mortgagees, and

55 all other investments shall thereupon pass, go to, and be held by, the continuing official trustees, if any, and the substituted official trustee or trustees, by virtue of such registration alone, without any conveyance or assignment.

5. The official trustees shall act under, and carry out, any Official trustees to be resolution of the trustees passed at a meeting of the trustees affecting under control of trustees. the said investments, and shall transfer, change, alter, and vary the same as the trustees may from time to time direct. In the event of 5 any official trustee refusing to obey such directions, the trustees may, by resolution passed at any of their meetings, remove such official trustee and appoint another in his place, under the power of appointing new trustees hereinafter contained.

6. Anything by this Act authorized to be done by the trustees Quorum and 10 may be done by any three of such trustees at any meeting of the appointment of trustees duly convened and on the records time and the second trustees at any meeting of the officers. trustees duly convened, under the regulations or bye-laws to be made under the power for that purpose hereinafter contained. The chairman of the trustees, shall, if present, preside at their meetings, and if he be not present at such meeting, then such other trustee as the trustees 15 present at such meeting shall choose shall preside thereat.

trustee presiding at any meeting of the trustees shall, in the event of an equal division of votes at such meeting, have a second or casting vote. The trustees may, from time to time, appoint a secretary and such other officers and employés as they shall think fit, and may 20 remove any persons so appointed, and they may pay such secretary, officers, and employés such salaries and remuneration as they think

fit; but under no circumstances shall the cost of managing and administering the said fund exceed the sum of two hundred pounds

25 7. All moneys raised by public subscription for the relief of the Moneys vested in sufferers by the accident which occurred in the Bulli Coal-mine afore-trustees. said, and forming the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund, and which at the time of the passing of this Act remain unexpended and are under the control of the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund Executive Committee, and 30 all lands and hereditaments held as security by way of mortgage for moneys advanced by the said trustees, are hereby vested in the said official trustees, subject nevertheless to the control of the trustees, and the said official trustees and their successors in office shall hold such

35 after advanced by the trustees, and all investments authorized by this Act for the purposes of the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund, subject to the control of the trustees.

8. All moneys vested in the official trustees by this Act shall The Mining Accident form, subject to the provisions herein contained, a fund under the Relief Fund. 40 name of the "Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund," hereinafter referred to as the "fund." All future subscriptions, donations, grants, and bequests to the fund, and all other moneys whatsoever from time to time received by the trustees in virtue of their office shall from time to time be invested in the names of the official trustees, and all such subscriptions, 45 donations, grants, and bequests shall form part of the capital moneys of the fund, and be applied and distributed under the provisions of

this Act.

9. All moneys forming part of the fund may be invested in Investment of fund. New South Wales Government Debentures or New South Wales 50 Government Inscribed Stock, or may be placed on deposit in any bank in Sydney incorporated by Act of Parliament or Royal Charter, in amounts not exceeding ten thousand pounds in any one bank, or may be lent on first mortgages of freehold lands, tenements, and hereditaments in the city of Sydney, or within ten miles thereof, and the 55 said investments may from time to time be altered and varied at the

discretion of the trustees.

10. The fund and the income derivable therefrom shall from Application of time to time be applied first in defraying all proper and reasonable income. costs, charges, and expenses of preparing and passing this Act, and

then of controlling, managing, and administering the fund, and carrying this Act into effect, such latter expenses however not to exceed the sum of two hundred pounds per annum, and then in making payments to the persons named in and in accordance with 5 the provisions of the Schedule hereto. Provided nevertheless that if at any time it shall appear necessary for the trustees to make any special exception in favour of paying any of the parties named in the said Schedule, or that may hereafter be proved to be in need of relief, a lump sum in satisfaction of any such relief, it shall be lawful for, 10 but not compulsory upon the trustees by special resolution duly passed at a meeting of the trustees, to make such payment in full, and thereupon and thereafter any person receiving such allowance shall have no further payment made to him or her, or have any claim what-

ever upon the fund. And all payments in the nature of a lump sum 15 that shall have been heretofore made by the said Executive Committee shall be deemed in full satisfaction of his or her interest in the fund.

11. In order that a complete and final distribution and winding Triennial adjustup of the fund may be effected, it shall be lawful for the trustees, ment of fund. and they are hereby empowered once in every three years, dating from 20 the said thirtieth day of September now last past, to hold a special meeting of the trustees, at which meeting the state of the fund shall be considered and the plan for the distribution of the same may be readjusted and the relief to be afforded to the said sufferers may be increased, diminished, or extended, and the Schedule hereto be altered 25 accordingly as the state of the fund and then existing circumstances

may require, and as to the trustees may seem expedient.

12. Any resolution so altering the said Schedule shall be passed Resolutions altering by the majority of the trustees present at such meeting and shall be Schedule to be registered upon the proceedings of the meetings of the trustees, and a 30 copy of the resolution of the trustees signed by the chairman of the said meeting shall be registered in the office of the Registrar-General free of charge, and shall also be published once in the Government Gazette.

13. No fresh or new applications for relief shall be entertained No fresh claims for 35 by the trustees after the thirtieth day of September, one thousand relief after 30th September 1890. eight hundred and ninety.

14. It shall be lawful for but not imperative upon the trustees Power to purchase at any time and from time to time after the said thirtieth day of annuities September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and after any 40 resolution passed by the majority of the trustees at a meeting called for that purpose, to purchase an annuity or annuities to be paid and payable to such person or persons as they shall think fit, who shall, on the said thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, be recipients of relief from the fund, and such annuities

45 if so purchased shall be terminable at the times corresponding to the periods when the sums mentioned in the Schedule hereunder written shall cease to be payable, and shall be a full and absolute payment in satisfaction of any relief granted by the trustees, and thereafter no such annuitant shall be entitled to any further payment whatever

50 from the fund.

15. The official trustees of the fund may institute or defend Actions and suits. any action or suit relative to any securities taken by the trustees in the names of the said official trustees for the purposes of the fund, and may, by the direction of the trustees, institute, prose-55 cute, or abandon any suit or action, civil or criminal, that may at any time become or be considered necessary for the protection, recovery, or due administration of the fund, or the investments thereof, and may defend any action or suit in respect thereof, and in every such action, suit, or proceeding, they may be styled the official trustees

trustees of the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund, without more, and any such action, suit, or proceeding, shall not be affected by any change in the persons for the time being holding the position of official trustees. All expenses incurred by the said official trustees in any such action or 5 suit shall be a charge upon the fund.

16. In all deeds or other instruments the official trustees of the Style of official said Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund may be so styled without the names trustees in deeds, &c.

or name of them, or any of them, being expressed.

17. The accounts of the trustees for the year ending on the Audit of accounts.

10 thirtieth day of September, in each year, shall be audited by such persons and in such manner as the trustees may from time to time direct.

18. The trustees shall in each and every year, as soon as the Statement of receipts yearly audit of their accounts is complete, cause to be prepared a and expenditure to be advertised. 15 statement, to be signed by the chairman of the trustees for the time

being, of all moneys received and expended by them, and the same shall be published once in the Government Gazette.

19. If any person named in the Schedule hereto, whether of Persons named in full age or a minor shall, whilst entitled to any payment from the Schodule becoming possessed of means 20 fund, become possessed of any means of support from any other source of support. other than his or her own earnings, the trustees shall reduce the amount of such payments, or may cease to make any such payments to such person. The trustees, notwithstanding that they have previously reduced the amount of, or ceased to make any such payments 25 as aforesaid to any person, may increase the amount of such payment

to the amount which would be payable under the provisions of the said Schedule, or to any smaller amount, or may where any such payments have been wholly discontinued by them, again make such payments as may be authorized by the provisions of the said Schedule.

30 If any person named in the said Schedule be in the receipt of relief from, or become an inmate of any charitable institution (except on account of temporary illness or temporary bodily infirmity), such person shall cease to be entitled to receive any payments from the fund. If any person named in the said Schedule shall dispose of, 35 transfer, anticipate, or assign his or her interest in any moneys coming

to him or her from the fund, or attempt so to do, all payments there-

from, to or on behalf of such person, shall thereupon cease.

20. Every agreement made by any trustees or officers to pay Misappropriation of any money out of the fund, except as herein provided, shall be null moneys

40 and void, and any trustee or other officer making such agreement, or paying any moneys out of the fund contrary to the provisions of this Act, shall immediately cease to be a trustee, and shall be removed from the office of trustee, and a new trustee shall be appointed in his

21. If the trustees hereby constituted, or any of them, or any Power to appoint 45 trustees or trustee to be appointed as hereinafter provided, or by any new trustees Court of competent jurisdiction, including any official trustee or trustees, shall die, or go to reside abroad, or desire to be discharged, or refuse or become incapable to act in the trusts hereof, or be removed 50 as hereinbefore mentioned, the remaining trustees shall at a meeting

to be duly convened for that purpose, within fourteen days of the occurrence of the vacancy, appoint some fit and proper person or persons residing in the Colony of New South Wales to be a new trustee or trustees or new official trustee or trustees, as the case may be, in

55 the place of the trustee or trustees so dying or going to reside abroad, or desiring to be discharged, or refusing or becoming incapable to act, or being removed as aforesaid. Provided always that no appointment of a new trustee or trustees shall be deemed invalid because it shall not have been made within the time hereinbefore limited for the exercise

exercise of the power of appointing new trustees. Provided also that an entry made in the minute book of the meetings of the trustees and duly registered as aforesaid, of the appointment of any person or persons to be new trustee or trustees, or new official trustee or trustees, 5 and purporting to be signed by the chairman at the meeting at which such appointment purports to have been made, shall be conclusive evidence of such appointment, and such appointment shall not afterwards be disputed on any ground whatsoever.

22. The receipt and receipts in writing of the trustees or the Trustees' receipts. 10 official trustees, for any moneys paid to them by any person, shall be sufficient discharge to such person, and he shall not be bound to enquire into the right of the said official or other trustees to receive the same, nor be answerable for any misapplication or nonapplication

15 23. The trustees or trustee, official trustees or official trustee Indemnity to for the time being of this Act, shall be respectively chargeable only for trustees such moneys, stocks, funds, and securities as they shall respectively actually receive, notwithstanding their respectively signing any receipt for the sake of conformity, and shall be answerable and accountable 20 only for their own acts, receipts, neglects, defaults, and not for those of each other, nor for any banker, broker, or other person with whom any moneys or securities belonging to the said fund may be deposited, nor for the insufficiency or deficiency of any stocks, funds, or securities, nor for any other loss, unless the same shall happen through their own 25 wilful default respectively.

24. The trustees shall have power from time to time to make, Power to make rules alter, and repeal regulations and by-laws not inconsistent with and regulations. the provisions of this Act, for regulating their proceedings and the conduct of their business, for regulating the duties of their officers and 30 employes, and for taking security for the due and faithful performance of their duty by such officers and employés, and generally for carrying

out the provisions of this Act.

SCHEDULE.

35 A QUARTERLY allowance of the sum of money set opposite the name of each person shall be paid to such person by the trustees, on the thirty-first day of December, the thirty-first day of March, the thirtieth day of June, and the thirtieth day of September in each year, or so soon thereafter as conveniently can be, but such payments shall cease in all cases where an annuity may be purchased under the provisions in the Act.

The persons hereinafter described as widows shall be entitled to such allowances

The persons hereinafter described as widows shall be entitled to such allowances respectively, so long as they remain widows, chaste, and of good repute.

If any widow shall again marry, the trustees shall pay her a sum of one hundred pounds, when all further claim by her upon the fund shall cease, but should any widow at the time of marriage be an annuitant, this provision shall be considered as satisfied.

The persons hereinafter described as boys shall receive their allowances respectively, until they attain the age of fifteen years, or become annuitants.

The persons hereinafter described as girls shall receive their allowances respectively, until they attain the age of fifteen years, or become annuitants.

The boys and girls hereinafter mentioned shall, for the purposes of this Act, be

An Act for the administration of the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund.

WHEREAS an explosion occurred in the Bulli Coal-mine, at Bulli, Preamble. in the Colony of New South Wales, in the month of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, by which a large number of persons lost their lives. And whereas a 5 large sum of money has been raised by public subscription with a view of affording pecuniary relief to the widows, orphans, and others left destitute by that disaster. And whereas the said sum of money (known as the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund) is administered under the direction of a Committee, known as the Bulli Disaster Fund Executive 10 Committee, and consisting of the following gentlemen, namely, His Worship the Mayor, the Honorable F. Abigail, Honorable J. Macintosh, Honorable G. A. Lloyd, the Mayor of Parramatta, the Mayor of Burwood, the Mayor of Darlington, Alderman Meeks, Alderman Beare, T. M. Slattery, E. C. Batt, W. C. Willis, the Honorary Treasurers, A. J. Riley, 15 Esq., M.L.A., G. Durham, the Honorary Secretaries, E. J. H. Knapp

and G. Hamilton, the Mayor of Melbourne, the Mayor of Wollongong, C. H. Hannell, T. W. Garlick, Henry Fry, and James Hunt. And whereas the said sum of money was chiefly deposited at interest in several of the public banks of the Colony of New South Wales, in

5 order that the same might be applied to the purposes aforesaid, in such manner as the said Committee should direct. And whereas the sum of Thirty-six thousand one hundred and seventy-four pounds one shilling and seven pence, being a portion of the said sum of money, remained

on the thirtieth day of September now last passed in the said several 10 banks unexpended. And whereas the said Committee have agreed to a scheme for the distribution of the said sum of Thirty-six thousand one hundred and seventy-four pounds one shilling and seven pence, and of the income to be derived therefrom, which said scheme, subject to the several payments made out of the said fund since the thirtieth day

15 of September last, is set forth in the Schedule to this Act. And whereas the persons forming the said Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund Executive Committee are anxious to be relieved from the duties and obligations imposed on them in connection with the management and control of the said moneys. And whereas it is expedient that they

20 should therefore be relieved therefrom, and that trustees should be appointed and provision be made for enforcing the conditions on which such moneys have been allotted, and for the proper and legal management of the said fund. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent Be it therefore enacted by the

25 of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. This Act may for all purposes be cited as the "Bulli Colliery Short title. Disaster Fund Act, 1888.'

2. The following gentlemen shall be the first trustees of the Appointment of 30 said Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund, namely, William Cain of Melbourne, Alban Joseph Riley of Sydney, Henry Buchanan of Newcastle, and William J. Poulter of Wollongong, the Honorable George Alfred Lloyd, M.L.C., the Honorable John Macintosh, M.L.C., John Meeks,

35 one of the Aldermen of the city of Sydney; and the word "trustees" hereinafter used, shall mean and signify the said first trustees and the substituted trustees who may from time to time be appointed trustees under the provisions hereinafter contained.

3. As soon as conveniently may be after the passing of this Official trustees to be 40 Act, a meeting of the trustees named in the last preceding section chosen. shall be summoned by Alban Joseph Riley, or in the event of his absence by the Honorable George Alfred Lloyd, for the purpose of electing official trustees. Not less than ten days' notice of such meeting shall be given in writing to each of the trustees, and at such

45 meeting three persons shall form a quorum. At such meeting the trustees voting either in person or by proxy shall elect two of the trustees to be official trustees of the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund, and shall also elect a chairman.

4. The names of the said official trustees shall be registered in Names to be 50 the office of the Registrar General free of charge, and whenever any registered. vacancy shall occur in their number, then upon the filling up of such vacancy under the power hereinafter contained, the name of such new trustee shall, in like manner, be registered in the said office, and any lands at that time vested in the said official trustees as mortgagees, and

55 all other investments shall thereupon pass, go to, and be held by, the continuing official trustees, if any, and the substituted official trustee or trustees, by virtue of such registration alone, without any conveyance or assignment. 5.

5. The official trustees shall act under, and carry out, any official trustees to be resolution of the trustees passed at a meeting of the trustees affecting under control of the said investments, and shall transfer, change, alter, and vary the same as the trustees may from time to time direct. In the event of 5 any official trustee refusing to obey such directions, the trustees may, by resolution passed at any of their meetings, remove such official trustee and appoint another in his place, under the power of appointing new trustees hereinafter contained.

6. Anything by this Act authorized to be done by the trustees Quorum and 10 may be done by any three of such trustees at any meeting of the appointment of trustees duly convened and the convened trustees at any meeting of the officers. trustees duly convened, under the regulations or bye-laws to be made under the power for that purpose hereinafter contained. The chairman of the trustees, shall, if present, preside at their meetings, and if he be not present at such meeting, then such other trustee as the trustees

15 present at such meeting shall choose shall preside thereat. trustee presiding at any meeting of the trustees shall, in the event of an equal division of votes at such meeting, have a second or casting The trustees may, from time to time, appoint a secretary and such other officers and employés as they shall think fit, and may

20 remove any persons so appointed, and they may pay such secretary, officers, and employés such salaries and remuneration as they think fit; but under no circumstances shall the cost of managing and administering the said fund exceed the sum of two hundred pounds

per annum.

7. All moneys raised by public subscription for the relief of the Moneys vested in sufferers by the accident which occurred in the Bulli Coal-mine afore-trustees. said, and forming the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund, and which at the time of the passing of this Act remain unexpended and are under the control of the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund Executive Committee, and 30 all lands and hereditaments held as security by way of mortgage for moneys advanced by the said trustees, are hereby vested in the said official trustees, subject nevertheless to the control of the trustees, and the said official trustees and their successors in office shall hold such

moneys, lands, and hereditaments, and all securities for moneys here-35 after advanced by the trustees, and all investments authorized by this Act for the purposes of the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund, subject to the

control of the trustees.

8. All moneys vested in the official trustees by this Act shall The Mining Accident

form, subject to the provisions herein contained, a fund under the Relief Fund.

40 name of the "Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund," hereinafter referred to as the "fund." All future subscriptions, donations, grants, and bequests to the fund, and all other moneys whatsoever from time to time received by the trustees in virtue of their office shall from time to time be invested in the names of the official trustees, and all such subscriptions,

45 donations, grants, and bequests shall form part of the capital moneys of the fund, and be applied and distributed under the provisions of

this Act.

9. All moneys forming part of the fund may be invested in Investment of fund. New South Wales Government Debentures or New South Wales 50 Government Inscribed Stock, or may be placed on deposit in any bank in Sydney incorporated by Act of Parliament or Royal Charter, in amounts not exceeding ten thousand pounds in any one bank, or may be lent on first mortgages of freehold lands, tenements, and hereditaments in the city of Sydney, or within ten miles thereof, and the 55 said investments may from time to time be altered and varied at the

discretion of the trustees. 10. The fund and the income derivable therefrom shall from Application of time to time be applied first in defraying all proper and reasonable income. costs, charges, and expenses of preparing and passing this Act, and

then of controlling, managing, and administering the fund, and carrying this Act into effect, such latter expenses however not to exceed the sum of two hundred pounds per annum, and then in making payments to the persons named in and in accordance with 5 the provisions of the Schedule hereto. Provided nevertheless that if at any time it shall appear necessary for the trustees to make any special exception in favour of paying any of the parties named in the said Schedule, or that may hereafter be proved to be in need of relief, a lump sum in satisfaction of any such relief, it shall be lawful for, 10 but not compulsory upon the trustees by special resolution duly passed at a meeting of the trustees, to make such payment in full, and thereupon and thereafter any person receiving such allowance shall have no further payment made to him or her, or have any claim what-

ever upon the fund. And all payments in the nature of a lump sum 15 that shall have been heretofore made by the said Executive Committee shall be deemed in full satisfaction of his or her interest in the fund.

11. In order that a complete and final distribution and winding Triennial adjust-up of the fund may be effected, it shall be lawful for the trustees, ment of fund. and they are hereby empowered once in every three years, dating from 20 the said thirtieth day of September now last past, to hold a special meeting of the trustees, at which meeting the state of the fund shall be considered and the plan for the distribution of the same may be readjusted and the relief to be afforded to the said sufferers may be increased, diminished, or extended, and the Schedule hereto be altered 25 accordingly as the state of the fund and then existing circumstances

may require, and as to the trustees may seem expedient.

12. Any resolution so altering the said Schedule shall be passed Resolutions altering by the majority of the trustees present at such meeting and shall be Schedule to be registered. entered upon the proceedings of the meetings of the trustees, and a 30 copy of the resolution of the trustees signed by the chairman of the said meeting shall be registered in the office of the Registrar-General free of charge, and shall also be published once in the Government Gazette.

13. No fresh or new applications for relief shall be entertained No fresh claims for 35 by the trustees after the thirtieth day of September, one thousand relief after 30th September 1890. eight hundred and ninety.

14. It shall be lawful for but not imperative upon the trustees Power to purchase at any time and from time to time after the said thirtieth day of annuities

September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and after any 40 resolution passed by the majority of the trustees at a meeting called for that purpose, to purchase an annuity or annuities to be paid and payable to such person or persons as they shall think fit, who shall, on the said thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, be recipients of relief from the fund, and such annuities 45 if so purchased shall be terminable at the times corresponding to the periods when the sums mentioned in the Schedule hereunder written

shall cease to be payable, and shall be a full and absolute payment in satisfaction of any relief granted by the trustees, and thereafter no such annuitant shall be entitled to any further payment whatever 50 from the fund.

15. The official trustees of the fund may institute or defend Actions and suits. any action or suit relative to any securities taken by the trustees in the names of the said official trustees for the purposes of the fund, and may, by the direction of the trustees, institute, prose-55 cute, or abandon any suit or action, civil or criminal, that may at any time become or be considered necessary for the protection, recovery, or due administration of the fund, or the investments thereof, and may defend any action or suit in respect thereof, and in every such action, suit, or proceeding, they may be styled the official

trustees of the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund, without more, and any such action, suit, or proceeding, shall not be affected by any change in the persons for the time being holding the position of official trustees. All expenses incurred by the said official trustees in any such action or 5 suit shall be a charge upon the fund.

16. In all deeds or other instruments the official trustees of the Style of official said Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund may be so styled without the names trustees in deeds, &c.

or name of them, or any of them, being expressed.

17. The accounts of the trustees for the year ending on the Audit of accounts.

If any person named in the Schedule hereto, whether of Persons named in full age or a minor shall, whilst entitled to any payment from the Schedule becoming possessed of means 20 fund, become possessed of any means of support from any other source of support. other than his or her own earnings, the trustees shall reduce the amount of such payments, or may cease to make any such payments The trustees, notwithstanding that they have preto such person. viously reduced the amount of, or ceased to make any such payments

25 as aforesaid to any person, may increase the amount of such payment to the amount which would be payable under the provisions of the said Schedule, or to any smaller amount, or may where any such payments have been wholly discontinued by them, again make such

payments as may be authorized by the provisions of the said Schedule. 30 If any person named in the said Schedule be in the receipt of relief from, or become an inmate of any charitable institution (except on account of temporary illness or temporary bodily infirmity), such person shall cease to be entitled to receive any payments from the fund. If any person named in the said Schedule shall dispose of,

35 transfer, anticipate, or assign his or her interest in any moneys coming to him or her from the fund, or attempt so to do, all payments there-

from, to or on behalf of such person, shall thereupon cease.

20. Every agreement made by any trustees or officers to pay Misappropriation of any money out of the fund, except as herein provided, shall be null moneys.

40 and void, and any trustee or other officer making such agreement, or paying any moneys out of the fund contrary to the provisions of this

Act, shall immediately cease to be a trustee, and shall be removed from the office of trustee, and a new trustee shall be appointed in his

place. 21. If the trustees hereby constituted, or any of them, or any Power to appoint 45 trustees or trustee to be appointed as hereinafter provided, or by any new trustees Court of competent jurisdiction, including any official trustee or trustees, shall die, or go to reside abroad, or desire to be discharged, or refuse or become incapable to act in the trusts hereof, or be removed 50 as hereinbefore mentioned, the remaining trustees shall at a meeting

each other, nor for any banker, broker, or other person with whom any moneys or securities belonging to the said fund may be deposited, nor for the insufficiency or deficiency of any stocks, funds, or securities, nor for any other loss, unless the same shall happen through their own

The trustees shall have power from time to time to make, Power to make rules alter, and repeal regulations and by-laws not inconsistent with and regulations. the provisions of this Act, for regulating their proceedings and the conduct of their business, for regulating the duties of their officers and 30 employés, and for taking security for the due and faithful performance

of their duty by such officers and employés, and generally for carrying out the provisions of this Act.

SCHEDULE.

35 A QUARTERLY allowance of the sum of money set opposite the name of each person shall be paid to such person by the trustees, on the thirty-first day of December, the thirty-first day of March, the thirtieth day of June, and the thirtieth day of September in each year, or so soon thereafter as conveniently can be, but such payments shall cease in all cases where an annuity may be purchased under the provisions in the Act.

The persons hereinafter described as widows shall be entitled to such allowances

If any widow shall again marry, the trustees shall pay her a sum of one hundred pounds, when all further claim by her upon the fund shall cease, but should any widow at the time of marriage be an annuitant, this provision shall be considered as satisfied.

The persons hereinafter described as boys shall receive their allowances respectively, until they attain the age of fifteen years, or become annuitants.

The persons hereinafter described as girls shall receive their allowances respectively, until they attain the age of fifteen years, or become annuitants.

The boys and girls hereinafter mentioned shall, for the purposes of this Act, be taken to have attained the ages set opposite their names on the thirtieth September, one 50 thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the case of any described as under one year shall be taken to have attained the age of one year on the thirtieth September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight. one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

Should any person or persons, other than those hereinafter mentioned, within the period of three years from the thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred 55 and eighty-seven, make any application to the trustees for relief out of the fund, the trustees may entertain such application, and may grant such relief as they, under the circumstances proved to them, may think fit, or may refuse such relief.

The provisions of this Schedule shall be read and construed as though the same

took effect on the thirtieth September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

An Act for the administration of the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund.

WHEREAS an explosion occurred in the Bulli Coal-mine, at Bulli, Preamble.

in the Colony of New South Wales, in the month of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, by which a large number of persons lost their lives. And whereas a large sum of money has been raised by public subscription with a view of affording pecuniary relief to the widows, orphans, and others left destitute by that disaster. And whereas the said sum of money (known as the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund) is administered under the direction of a Committee, known as the Bulli Disaster Fund Executive

10 Committee, and consisting of the following gentlemen, namely, His Worship the Mayor, the Honorable F. Abigail, Honorable J. Macintosh, Honorable G. A. Lloyd, the Mayor of Parramatta, the Mayor of Burwood, the Mayor of Darlington, Alderman Meeks, Alderman Beare, T. M. Slattery, E. C. Batt, W. C. Willis, the Honorary Treasurers, A. J. Riley, 15 Esq., M.L.A., G. Durham, the Honorary Secretaries, E. J. H. Knapp c 5—A

and G. Hamilton, the Mayor of Melbourne, the Mayor of Wollongong, C. H. Hannell, T. W. Garlick, Henry Fry, and James Hunt. And whereas the said sum of money was chiefly deposited at interest in several of the public banks of the Colony of New South Wales, in

And whereas the said Committee have agreed to a scheme for the distribution of the said sum of Thirty-six thousand one hundred and seventy-four pounds one shilling and seven pence, and of the income to be derived therefrom, which said scheme, subject to the several payments made out of the said fund since the thirtieth day

15 of September last, is set forth in the Schedule to this Act. And whereas the persons forming the said Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund Executive Committee are anxious to be relieved from the duties and obligations imposed on them in connection with the management and control of the said moneys. And whereas it is expedient that they

20 should therefore be relieved therefrom, and that trustees should be appointed and provision be made for enforcing the conditions on which such moneys have been allotted, and for the proper and legal management of the said fund. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent 25 of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South

Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

1. This Act may for all purposes be cited as the "Bulli Colliery Short title. Disaster Fund Act, 1888.'

2. The following gentlemen shall be the first trustees of the Appointment of 30 said Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund, namely, William Cain of Melbourne, Alban Joseph Riley of Sydney, Henry Buchanan of Newcastle, and William J. Poulter of Wollongong, the Honorable George Alfred Lloyd, M.L.C., the Honorable John Macintosh, M.L.C., John Meeks,

35 one of the Aldermen of the city of Sydney; and the word "trustees" hereinafter used, shall mean and signify the said first trustees and the substituted trustees who may from time to time be appointed trustees under the provisions hereinafter contained.

3. As soon as conveniently may be after the passing of this Official trustees to be 40 Act, a meeting of the trustees named in the last preceding section chosen. shall be summoned by Alban Joseph Riley, or in the event of his absence by the Honorable George Alfred Lloyd, for the purpose of electing official trustees. Not less than ten days' notice of such meeting shall be given in writing to each of the trustees, and at such

45 meeting three persons shall form a quorum. At such meeting the trustees voting either in person or by proxy shall elect two of the trustees to be official trustees of the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund, and shall also elect a chairman.

4. The names of the said official trustees shall be registered in Names to be 50 the office of the Registrar General free of charge, and whenever any registered. vacancy shall occur in their number, then upon the filling up of such vacancy under the power hereinafter contained, the name of such new trustee shall, in like manner, be registered in the said office, and any lands at that time vested in the said official trustees as mortgagees, and

55 all other investments shall thereupon pass, go to, and be held by, the continuing official trustees, if any, and the substituted official trustee or trustees, by virtue of such registration alone, without any conveyance or assignment. 5.

5. The official trustees shall act under, and carry out, any official trustees to be resolution of the trustees passed at a meeting of the trustees affecting under control of the said investments, and shall transfer, change, alter, and vary the same as the trustees may from time to time direct. In the event of 5 any official trustee refusing to obey such directions, the trustees may, by resolution passed at any of their meetings, remove such official trustee and appoint another in his place, under the power of appointing new trustees hereinafter contained.

6. Anything by this Act authorized to be done by the trustees Quorum and 10 may be done by any three of such trustees at any meeting of the appointment of trustees duly convened, under the regulations or bye-laws to be made under the power for that purpose hereinafter contained. The chairman of the trustees, shall, if present, preside at their meetings, and if he be not present at such meeting, then such other trustee as the trustees

15 present at such meeting shall choose shall preside thereat. trustee presiding at any meeting of the trustees shall, in the event of an equal division of votes at such meeting, have a second or casting vote. The trustees may, from time to time, appoint a secretary and such other officers and employés as they shall think fit, and may

20 remove any persons so appointed, and they may pay such secretary, officers, and employés such salaries and remuneration as they think fit; but under no circumstances shall the cost of managing and administering the said fund exceed the sum of two hundred pounds

per annum.

7. All moneys raised by public subscription for the relief of the Moneys vested in sufferers by the accident which occurred in the Bulli Coal-mine afore-trustees. said, and forming the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund, and which at the time of the passing of this Act remain unexpended and are under the control of the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund Executive Committee, and 30 all lands and hereditaments held as security by way of mortgage for moneys advanced by the said trustees, are hereby vested in the said official trustees, subject nevertheless to the control of the trustees, and the said official trustees and their successors in office shall hold such

moneys, lands, and hereditaments, and all securities for moneys here-35 after advanced by the trustees, and all investments authorized by this Act for the purposes of the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund, subject to the

control of the trustees.

8. All moneys vested in the official trustees by this Act shall The Mining Accident form, subject to the provisions herein contained, a fund under the Relief Fund.

40 name of the "Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund," hereinafter referred to as the "fund." All future subscriptions, donations, grants, and bequests to the fund, and all other moneys whatsoever from time to time received by the trustees in virtue of their office shall from time to time be invested in the names of the official trustees, and all such subscriptions, 45 donations, grants, and bequests shall form part of the capital moneys of the fund, and be applied and distributed under the provisions of

this Act. 9. All moneys forming part of the fund may be invested in Investment of fund. New South Wales Government Debentures or New South Wales 50 Government Inscribed Stock, or may be placed on deposit in any bank in Sydney incorporated by Act of Parliament or Royal Charter, in amounts not exceeding ten thousand pounds in any one bank, or may be lent on first mortgages of freehold lands, tenements, and hereditaments in the city of Sydney, or within ten miles thereof, and the 55 said investments may from time to time be altered and varied at the discretion of the trustees.

10. The fund and the income derivable therefrom shall from Application of time to time be applied first in defraying all proper and reasonable income. costs, charges, and expenses of preparing and passing this Act, and

then of controlling, managing, and administering the fund, and carrying this Act into effect, such latter expenses however not to exceed the sum of two hundred pounds per annum, and then in making payments to the persons named in and in accordance with 5 the provisions of the Schedule hereto. Provided nevertheless that if at any time it shall appear necessary for the trustees to make any special exception in favour of paying any of the parties named in the said Schedule, or that may hereafter be proved to be in need of relief, a lump sum in satisfaction of any such relief, it shall be lawful for, 10 but not compulsory upon the trustees by special resolution duly passed at a meeting of the trustees, to make such payment in full, and thereupon and thereafter any person receiving such allowance shall have no further payment made to him or her, or have any claim whatever upon the fund. And all payments in the nature of a lump sum

15 that shall have been heretofore made by the said Executive Committee shall be deemed in full satisfaction of his or her interest in the fund.

11. In order that a complete and final distribution and winding Triennial adjustup of the fund may be effected, it shall be lawful for the trustees, ment of fund. and they are hereby empowered once in every three years, dating from 20 the said thirtieth day of September now last past, to hold a special meeting of the trustees, at which meeting the state of the fund shall be considered and the plan for the distribution of the same may be readjusted and the relief to be afforded to the said sufferers may be increased, diminished, or extended, and the Schedule hereto be altered 25 accordingly as the state of the fund and then existing circumstances

may require, and as to the trustees may seem expedient.

12. Any resolution so altering the said Schedule shall be passed Resolutions altering by the majority of the trustees present at such meeting and shall be Schedule to be registered upon the proceedings of the meetings of the trustees, and a 30 copy of the resolution of the trustees signed by the chairman of the said meeting shall be registered in the office of the Registrar-General free of charge, and shall also be published once in the Government Gazette.

13. No fresh or new applications for relief shall be entertained No fresh claims for 35 by the trustees after the thirtieth day of September, one thousand relief after 30th September 1890. eight hundred and ninety.

14. It shall be lawful for but not imperative upon the trustees Power to purchase at any time and from time to time after the said thirtieth day of annuities.

September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and after any 40 resolution passed by the majority of the trustees at a meeting called for that purpose, to purchase an annuity or annuities to be paid and payable to such person or persons as they shall think fit, who shall, on the said thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, be recipients of relief from the fund, and such annuities 45 if so purchased shall be terminable at the times corresponding to the

periods when the sums mentioned in the Schedule hereunder written shall cease to be payable, and shall be a full and absolute payment in satisfaction of any relief granted by the trustees, and thereafter no such annuitant shall be entitled to any further payment whatever 50 from the fund.

15. The official trustees of the fund may institute or defend Actions and suits. any action or suit relative to any securities taken by the trustees in the names of the said official trustees for the purposes of the fund, and may, by the direction of the trustees, institute, prose-55 cute, or abandon any suit or action, civil or criminal, that may at any time become or be considered necessary for the protection, recovery, or due administration of the fund, or the investments thereof, and may defend any action or suit in respect thereof, and in every such action, suit, or proceeding, they may be styled the official

trustees of the Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund, without more, and any such action, suit, or proceeding, shall not be affected by any change in the persons for the time being holding the position of official trustees. All expenses incurred by the said official trustees in any such action or 5 suit shall be a charge upon the fund.

16. In all deeds or other instruments the official trustees of the Style of official said Bulli Colliery Disaster Fund may be so styled without the names trustees in deeds, &c.

or name of them, or any of them, being expressed.

17. The accounts of the trustees for the year ending on the Audit of accounts. 10 thirtieth day of September, in each year, shall be audited by such persons and in such manner as the trustees may from time to time direct.

18. The trustees shall in each and every year, as soon as the Statement of receipts yearly audit of their accounts is complete, cause to be prepared a and expenditure to be advertised. 15 statement, to be signed by the chairman of the trustees for the time being, of all moneys received and expended by them, and the same shall be published once in the Government Gazette.

19. If any person named in the Schedule hereto, whether of Persons named in full age or a minor shall, whilst entitled to any payment from the Schedule becoming possessed of means 20 fund, become possessed of any means of support from any other source of support. other than his or her own earnings, the trustees shall reduce the amount of such payments, or may cease to make any such payments to such person. The trustees, notwithstanding that they have previously reduced the amount of, or ceased to make any such payments

25 as aforesaid to any person, may increase the amount of such payment to the amount which would be payable under the provisions of the said Schedule, or to any smaller amount, or may where any such payments have been wholly discontinued by them, again make such payments as may be authorized by the provisions of the said Schedule.

30 If any person named in the said Schedule be in the receipt of relief from, or become an inmate of any charitable institution (except on account of temporary illness or temporary bodily infirmity), such person shall cease to be entitled to receive any payments from the fund. If any person named in the said Schedule shall dispose of, 35 transfer, anticipate, or assign his or her interest in any moneys coming

to him or her from the fund, or attempt so to do, all payments therefrom, to or on behalf of such person, shall thereupon cease.

20. Every agreement made by any trustees or officers to pay Misappropriation of any money out of the fund, except as herein provided, shall be null moneys. 40 and void, and any trustee or other officer making such agreement, or paying any moneys out of the fund contrary to the provisions of this

Act, shall immediately cease to be a trustee, and shall be removed from the office of trustee, and a new trustee shall be appointed in his place.

45 21. If the trustees hereby constituted, or any of them, or any Power to appoint trustees or trustee to be appointed as hereinafter provided, or by any new trustee Court of competent jurisdiction, including any official trustee or trustees, shall die, or go to reside abroad, or desire to be discharged, or refuse or become incapable to act in the trusts hereof, or be removed 50 as hereinbefore mentioned, the remaining trustees shall at a meeting to be duly convened for that purpose, within fourteen days of the occurrence of the vacancy, appoint some fit and proper person or persons residing in the Colony of New South Wales to be a new trustee or trustees or new official trustee or trustees, as the case may be, in

55 the place of the trustee or trustees so dying or going to reside abroad, or desiring to be discharged, or refusing or becoming incapable to act, or being removed as aforesaid. Provided always that no appointment of a new trustee or trustees shall be deemed invalid because it shall not have been made within the time hereinbefore limited for the

exercise

exercise of the power of appointing new trustees. Provided also that an entry made in the minute book of the meetings of the trustees and duly registered as aforesaid, of the appointment of any person or persons to be new trustee or trustees, or new official trustee or trustees, 5 and purporting to be signed by the chairman at the meeting at which such appointment purports to have been made, shall be conclusive evidence of such appointment, and such appointment shall not afterwards be disputed on any ground whatsoever.

22. The receipt and receipts in writing of the trustees or the Trustees' receipts. 10 official trustees, for any moneys paid to them by any person, shall be sufficient discharge to such person, and he shall not be bound to enquire into the right of the said official or other trustees to receive the same, nor be answerable for any misapplication or nonapplication thereof.

15 23. The trustees or trustee, official trustees or official trustee Indemnity to for the time being of this Act, shall be respectively chargeable only for trustees. such moneys, stocks, funds, and securities as they shall respectively actually receive, notwithstanding their respectively signing any receipt for the sake of conformity, and shall be answerable and accountable

20 only for their own acts, receipts, neglects, defaults, and not for those of each other, nor for any banker, broker, or other person with whom any moneys or securities belonging to the said fund may be deposited, nor for the insufficiency or deficiency of any stocks, funds, or securities, nor for any other loss, unless the same shall happen through their own 25 wilful default respectively.

24. The trustees shall have power from time to time to make, Power to make rules alter, and repeal regulations and by-laws not inconsistent with and regulations. the provisions of this Act, for regulating their proceedings and the

conduct of their business, for regulating the duties of their officers and 30 employés, and for taking security for the due and faithful performance of their duty by such officers and employés, and generally for carrying out the provisions of this Act.

SCHEDULE.

A QUARTERLY allowance of the sum of money set opposite the name of each person 35 shall be paid to such person by the trustees, on the thirty-first day of December, the thirty-first day of March, the thirtieth day of June, and the thirtieth day of September in each year, or so soon thereafter as conveniently can be, but such payments shall cease in all cases where an annuity may be purchased under the provisions in the Act.

The persons hereinafter described as widows shall be entitled to such allowances

40 respectively, so long as they remain widows, chaste, and of good repute.

If any widow shall again marry, the trustees shall pay her a sum of one hundred pounds, when all further claim by her upon the fund shall cease, but should any widow at the time of marriage be an annuitant, this provision shall be considered as satisfied.

The persons hereinafter described as boys shall receive their allowances respectively.

45 tively, until they attain the age of fifteen years, or become annuitants.

The persons hereinafter described as girls shall receive their allowances respec-

tively, until they attain the age of fifteen years, or become annuitants.

The boys and girls hereinafter mentioned shall, for the purposes of this Act, be taken to have attained the ages set opposite their names on the thirtieth September, one 50 thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the case of any described as under one year shall be taken to have attained the age of one year on the thirtieth September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

Should any person or persons, other than those hereinafter mentioned, within the period of three years from the thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, make any application to the trustees for relief out of the fund, the trustees may entertain such application, and may grant such relief as they, under the circumstances proved to them, may think fit, or may refuse such relief.

The provisions of this Schedule shall be read and construed as though the same

took effect on the thirtieth September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.
