

No. XVII.

An Act to enable the Railway Commissioners of New South Wales to close a certain Level Crossing near Auburn Railway Station. [Assented to, 30th September, 1889.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lorichtic the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the

authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Railway Commissioners of New South Wales are hereby closing of Level authorized and empowered to close the Level Crossing over the Railway Crossing near line between Sydney and Parramatta, situate two hundred and ninetysix feet, or thereabout, westerly from the western end of the Down Platform at Auburn Railway Station, and distant eleven miles fortytwo chains and sixty-two links from Redfern Railway Station; which said Crossing was provided to give access across the Railway line between the North Parade and the South Parade at Auburn. And from and after the publication of a notification in the Gazette by the said Commissioners that the said Crossing has been closed under the authority of this Act, all rights of way on and over such Crossing shall be extinguished.

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
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I Certify that this Public Bill, which originated in the Legislative Assembly, has finally passed the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales.
