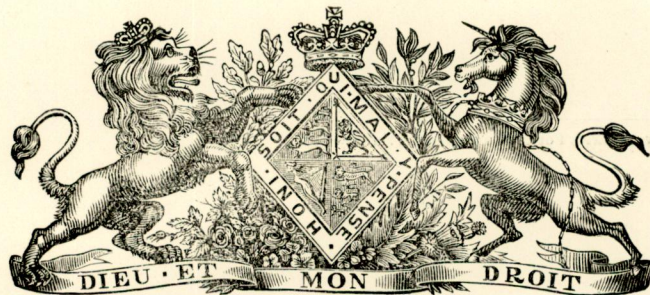

WHEREAS it is expedient to simplify and cheapen the registration Preamble.

Bills of Sale Law Amendment.

2. 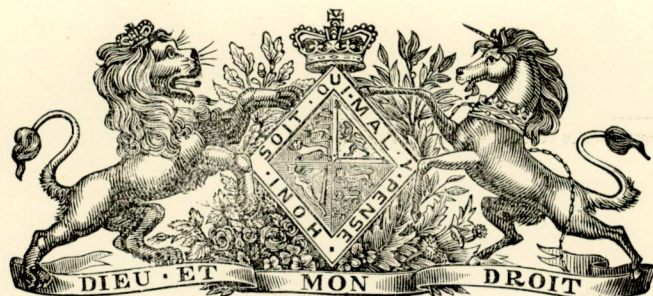
