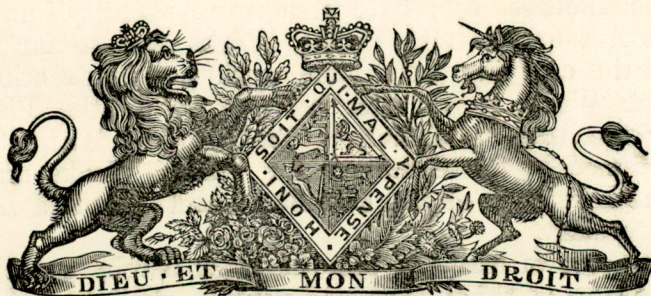

WHEREAS, pursuant to the "Public Works Act of 1888," a Preamble. certain proposed Public Work, namely, "The Erection of Offices for the Accommodation of the Board of Water Supply and Sewerage," was, on the first day of October, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, duly submitted and explained by the Secretary for Public Works in the Legislative Assembly, and such work was thereupon referred, on the motion of the said Minister, to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works, which Committee reported thereon to the said Assembly pursuant to the said Act. And whereas on the eighteenth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety, the said Assembly by resolution declared "that it is expedient that the erection of offices for the Board of Water Supply and Sewerage, as referred by the Legislative Assembly to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works, be carried out." The Public Work more particularly described in the Schedule to this Act shall be carried out by the Secretary for Public Works, or the Member of the Executive Council for the time being charged with the duties of the said Minister. And such Minister or Member shall for the purposes of this Act and the "Public Works Act of 1888" be deemed and taken to be the "Constructing Authority" authorized to enter into contracts, and to exercise all powers, do all acts and things, and be responsible in respect of all obligations and liabilities which can be done or incurred by a "Constructing Authority" under or pursuant to this Act or the said Public Works Act, so far as may be necessary for the carrying out of the work hereby sanctioned. The Plan of such Work, hereinafter referred to, is the Plan marked "Offices for the Accommodation of the Board of Water Supply and Sewerage," signed by the Secretary for Public Works and countersigned by the President of the said Board and deposited in the office of the said Secretary.

Cost, how to be defrayed.

3. The cost of carrying out the work hereby sanctioned, estimated at the sum of thirty thousand pounds, shall be defrayed from moneys to be provided by Parliament by loan.
