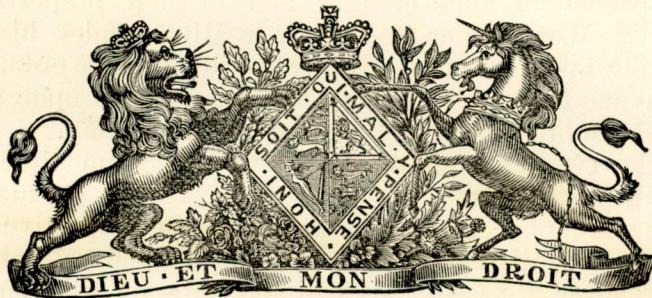

WHEREAS we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects Preamble. the Members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, have resolved to grant to Your Majesty the sum of Six hundred and ninety-one thousand two hundred and twenty pounds, that is to say—

The sum of Four hundred and ninety thousand six hundred and seventy pounds, being the sum required to defray the expenses of the various Departments and Services of the Colony for the month of July, or following month of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine. And

The sum of Two hundred thousand five hundred and fifty pounds for the Services set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed.

And whereas we desire to make good out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales the sum so granted to Her Majesty: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with

Consolidated Revenue Fund (No. 4).

with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Treasurer to pay under Governor's Warrant or Order.
