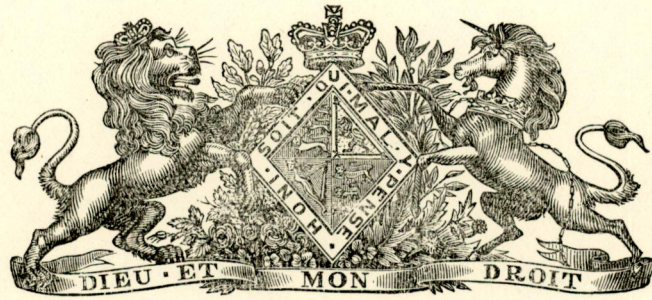

An Act to amend the "Constitution Act Amendment Act of 1884."

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the law relating to the ^{Preamble.} incapacity of persons holding offices of profit under the Crown to sit or vote as Members of the Legislative Assembly until after the election of such persons after they shall have accepted an office of profit under the Crown. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. From and after the passing of this Act the seat of any ^{Seat of Member not to become vacant on acceptance of office.} Member of the Legislative Assembly who shall accept any office of profit under the Crown during pleasure, or for a term of years, being any one of the offices enumerated in the Schedule to the "Constitution Act Amendment Act of 1884," or which may hereafter be created by any Act of Parliament, as an office of the Executive Government, shall not thereby become vacated or be void, nor shall there be any necessity for a writ to issue for a new Election.

2. This Act may be cited as the "Ministerial Election Act ^{Title.} of 1889."

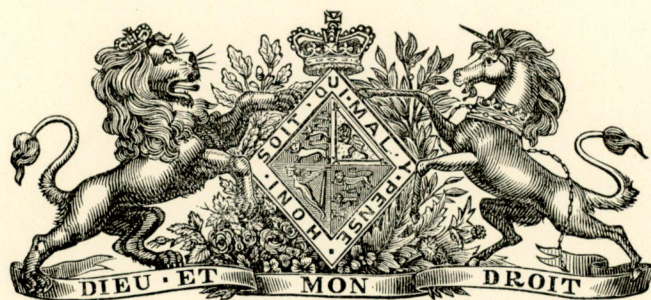
