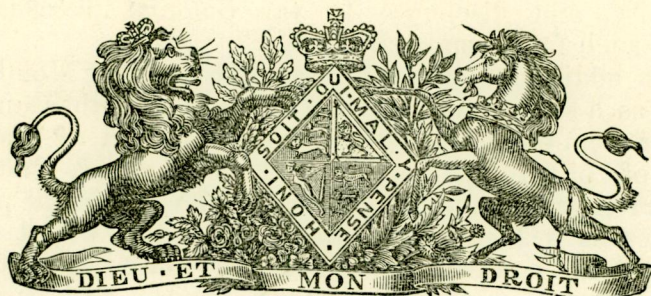

An Act to provide for the remuneration of the Members of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works. [Assented to, 21st September, 1889.]

WHEREAS in the exercise of their office under the "Public Works Act of 1888" and the "Public Works Act Amendment Act of 1889," the Members of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works are required to undertake duties of a specially important and onerous nature, which duties are in a large measure beyond the scope of ordinary Parliamentary service; And whereas it is considered just that such services should be remunerated, and that travelling expenses should be allowed to the Members of every such Committee in the manner hereinafter provided. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Public Works (Committees' Remuneration) Act of 1889." Short title.

2. The Members of every Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works, including the Standing Committee first appointed under the "Public Works Act of 1888," shall each receive, by way of remuneration for his services as a Member of such Committee, a fee Fees to be paid to Members of Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works. for

Provided that nothing in this Act shall be taken to constitute the office of any Member of the said Committee an office of profit, so as to render such Member incapable of sitting or voting as a Member of the Legislature, or to make void the election of such Member.
