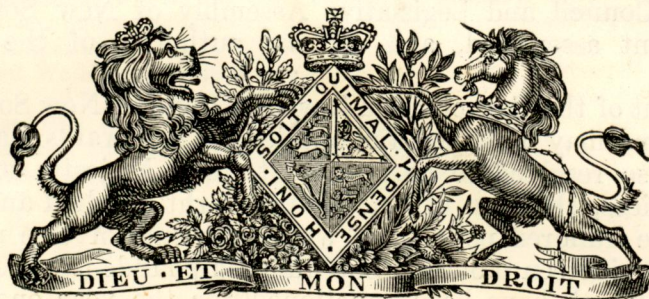

No. XVIII.

An Act to apply certain Sums out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales, towards the Services of the Year 1889; and to indemnify the Colonial Treasurer, the Officers of the Treasury, and other Public Officers, in respect of certain unauthorized advances from the Public Account of the Colonial Treasurer in the Associated Banks. [Assented to, 8th March, 1889.]

**W**HEREAS we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects the Members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, have resolved to grant to Your Majesty the sum of One million eight hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred pounds, that is to say—

The sum of One million six hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred pounds, being the sum required to defray the expenses of the various Departments and Services of the Colony for the months of January, February, and March, or following month of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine. And

The sum of Two hundred thousand pounds for the Service set forth in the First Schedule hereto:

And whereas we desire to make good out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales the sum so granted to Her Majesty: And whereas certain sums of money have been withdrawn from the Public Account

Account of the Colonial Treasurer in the Associated Banks without the authority of Parliament for the purpose of paying the claims of contractors and others in anticipation of the sanction of Parliament, which said sums are shown in the Second Schedule hereto, and amount to the sum of Six hundred and twenty-five thousand six hundred and eleven pounds one shilling and fourpence: And whereas the respective sums so withdrawn and payments so made were necessary to carry on and maintain the Public Service: And whereas it is expedient to indemnify all persons concerned or engaged in the matter of such withdrawals or payments. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

£1,819,100 may be issued out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

1. Out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales there shall and may be issued and applied for or towards making good the supply so resolved to be granted to Her Majesty for the said several Services, the sum of One Million eight hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred pounds, of which the sum of One million six hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred pounds is to be expended at the rates which have been sanctioned for the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, subject to the rate of any reduction that may hereafter be made in the expenditure of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and Two hundred thousand pounds for the Service specified in the First Schedule hereto.

Treasurer to pay under Governor's Warrant or Order.

2. The Treasurer shall issue and pay the said sum for the Services aforesaid in such manner and in such proportions as the Governor, by Warrants or Orders in writing under his hand and directed to the said Treasurer, shall from time to time order and direct. And the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony.

Treasurer to have credit and receipts to discharge him.

3. The Treasurer shall, in his accounts from time to time, be allowed credit for all sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such Warrants or Orders. And the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be full and valid discharges to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for such sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

Indemnity to Colonial Treasurer and his Officers, &c.

4. The Colonial Treasurer, the Officers of the Treasury, and all persons whosoever concerned or engaged in making the said withdrawals or payments, are hereby indemnified and held harmless for and in respect of the withdrawal and expenditure of the said sum of Six hundred and twenty-five thousand six hundred and eleven pounds one shilling and fourpence.

Short title.

5. This Act may be cited as the "Supply and Indemnity Act 1889."

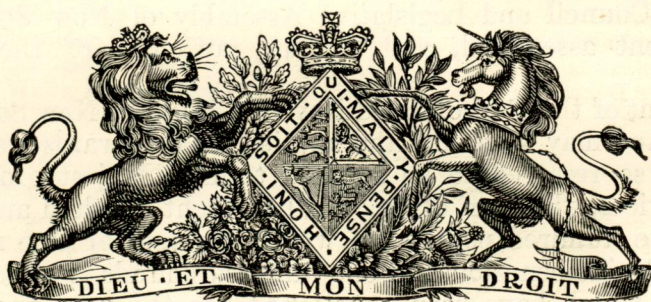

### No. XVIII.

An Act to apply certain Sums out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales, towards the Services of the Year 1889; and to indemnify the Colonial Treasurer, the Officers of the Treasury, and other Public Officers, in respect of certain unauthorized advances from the Public Account of the Colonial Treasurer in the Associated Banks. [Assented to, 8th March, 1889.]

**W**HEREAS we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects Preamble.  
the Members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales  
in Parliament assembled, have resolved to grant to Your Majesty the  
sum of One million eight hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred  
pounds, that is to say—

The sum of One million six hundred and nineteen thousand one  
hundred pounds, being the sum required to defray the  
expenses of the various Departments and Services of the  
Colony for the months of January, February, and March,  
or following month of the year one thousand eight hundred  
and eighty-nine. And

The sum of Two hundred thousand pounds for the Service set  
forth in the First Schedule hereto:

And whereas we desire to make good out of the Consolidated Revenue  
Fund of New South Wales the sum so granted to Her Majesty: And  
whereas certain sums of money have been withdrawn from the Public  
Account

Account of the Colonial Treasurer in the Associated Banks without the authority of Parliament for the purpose of paying the claims of contractors and others in anticipation of the sanction of Parliament, which said sums are shown in the Second Schedule hereto, and amount to the sum of Six hundred and twenty-five thousand six hundred and eleven pounds one shilling and fourpence: And whereas the respective sums so withdrawn and payments so made were necessary to carry on and maintain the Public Service: And whereas it is expedient to indemnify all persons concerned or engaged in the matter of such withdrawals or payments. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

£1,819,100 may be issued out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

1. Out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales there shall and may be issued and applied for or towards making good the supply so resolved to be granted to Her Majesty for the said several Services, the sum of One Million eight hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred pounds, of which the sum of One million six hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred pounds is to be expended at the rates which have been sanctioned for the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, subject to the rate of any reduction that may hereafter be made in the expenditure of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and Two hundred thousand pounds for the Service specified in the First Schedule hereto.

Treasurer to pay under Governor's Warrant or Order.

2. The Treasurer shall issue and pay the said sum for the Services aforesaid in such manner and in such proportions as the Governor, by Warrants or Orders in writing under his hand and directed to the said Treasurer, shall from time to time order and direct. And the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony.

Treasurer to have credit and receipts to discharge him.

3. The Treasurer shall, in his accounts from time to time, be allowed credit for all sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such Warrants or Orders. And the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be full and valid discharges to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for such sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

Indemnity to Colonial Treasurer and his Officers, &c.

4. The Colonial Treasurer, the Officers of the Treasury, and all persons whosoever concerned or engaged in making the said withdrawals or payments, are hereby indemnified and held harmless for and in respect of the withdrawal and expenditure of the said sum of Six hundred and twenty-five thousand six hundred and eleven pounds one shilling and fourpence.

Short title.

5. This Act may be cited as the "Supply and Indemnity Act 1889."

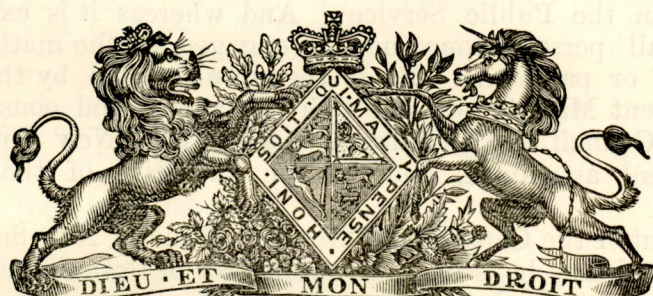

### No. XVIII.

An Act to apply certain Sums out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales, towards the Services of the Year 1889; and to indemnify the Colonial Treasurer, the Officers of the Treasury, and other Public Officers, in respect of certain unauthorized advances from the Public Account of the Colonial Treasurer in the Associated Banks. [Assented to, 8th March, 1889.]

**W**HEREAS we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects Preamble.  
the Members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, have resolved to grant to Your Majesty the sum of One million eight hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred pounds, that is to say—

The sum of One million six hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred pounds, being the sum required to defray the expenses of the various Departments and Services of the Colony for the months of January, February, and March, or following month of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine. And

The sum of Two hundred thousand pounds for the Service set forth in the First Schedule hereto:

And whereas we desire to make good out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales the sum so granted to Her Majesty: And whereas certain sums of money have been withdrawn from the Public Account

Account of the Colonial Treasurer in the Associated Banks without the authority of Parliament for the purpose of paying the claims of contractors and others in anticipation of the sanction of Parliament, which said sums are shown in the Second Schedule hereto, and amount to the sum of Six hundred and twenty-five thousand six hundred and eleven pounds one shilling and fourpence : And whereas the respective sums so withdrawn and payments so made were necessary to carry on and maintain the Public Service : And whereas it is expedient to indemnify all persons concerned or engaged in the matter of such withdrawals or payments. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

£1,819,100 may be  
issued out of the  
Consolidated  
Revenue Fund.

1. Out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales there shall and may be issued and applied for or towards making good the supply so resolved to be granted to Her Majesty for the said several Services, the sum of One Million eight hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred pounds, of which the sum of One million six hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred pounds is to be expended at the rates which have been sanctioned for the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, subject to the rate of any reduction that may hereafter be made in the expenditure of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and Two hundred thousand pounds for the Service specified in the First Schedule hereto.

Treasurer to pay  
under Governor's  
Warrant or Order.

2. The Treasurer shall issue and pay the said sum for the Services aforesaid in such manner and in such proportions as the Governor, by Warrants or Orders in writing under his hand and directed to the said Treasurer, shall from time to time order and direct. And the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony.

Treasurer to have  
credit and receipts  
to discharge him.

3. The Treasurer shall, in his accounts from time to time, be allowed credit for all sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such Warrants or Orders. And the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be full and valid discharges to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for such sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

Indemnity to  
Colonial Treasurer  
and his Officers, &c.

4. The Colonial Treasurer, the Officers of the Treasury, and all persons whosoever concerned or engaged in making the said withdrawals or payments, are hereby indemnified and held harmless for and in respect of the withdrawal and expenditure of the said sum of Six hundred and twenty-five thousand six hundred and eleven pounds one shilling and fourpence.

Short title.

5. This Act may be cited as the "Supply and Indemnity Act 1889."

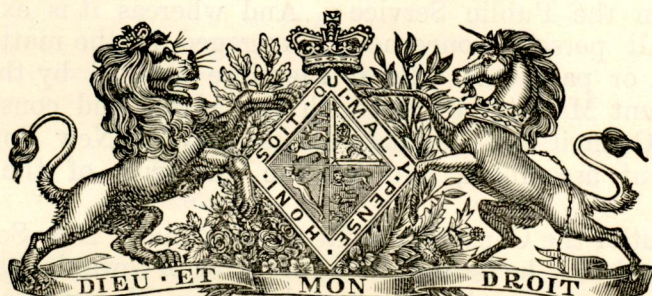

### No. XVIII.

An Act to apply certain Sums out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales, towards the Services of the Year 1889; and to indemnify the Colonial Treasurer, the Officers of the Treasury, and other Public Officers, in respect of certain unauthorized advances from the Public Account of the Colonial Treasurer in the Associated Banks. [Assented to, 8th March, 1889.]

**W**HEREAS we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects Preamble.  
the Members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, have resolved to grant to Your Majesty the sum of One million eight hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred pounds, that is to say—

The sum of One million six hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred pounds, being the sum required to defray the expenses of the various Departments and Services of the Colony for the months of January, February, and March, or following month of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine. And

The sum of Two hundred thousand pounds for the Service set forth in the First Schedule hereto:

And whereas we desire to make good out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales the sum so granted to Her Majesty: And whereas certain sums of money have been withdrawn from the Public Account

Account of the Colonial Treasurer in the Associated Banks without the authority of Parliament for the purpose of paying the claims of contractors and others in anticipation of the sanction of Parliament, which said sums are shown in the Second Schedule hereto, and amount to the sum of Six hundred and twenty-five thousand six hundred and eleven pounds one shilling and fourpence: And whereas the respective sums so withdrawn and payments so made were necessary to carry on and maintain the Public Service: And whereas it is expedient to indemnify all persons concerned or engaged in the matter of such withdrawals or payments. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

£1,819,100 may be issued out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

1. Out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales there shall and may be issued and applied for or towards making good the supply so resolved to be granted to Her Majesty for the said several Services, the sum of One Million eight hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred pounds, of which the sum of One million six hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred pounds is to be expended at the rates which have been sanctioned for the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, subject to the rate of any reduction that may hereafter be made in the expenditure of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and Two hundred thousand pounds for the Service specified in the First Schedule hereto.

Treasurer to pay under Governor's Warrant or Order.

2. The Treasurer shall issue and pay the said sum for the Services aforesaid in such manner and in such proportions as the Governor, by Warrants or Orders in writing under his hand and directed to the said Treasurer, shall from time to time order and direct. And the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony.

Treasurer to have credit and receipts to discharge him.

3. The Treasurer shall, in his accounts from time to time, be allowed credit for all sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such Warrants or Orders. And the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be full and valid discharges to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for such sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

Indemnity to Colonial Treasurer and his Officers, &c.

4. The Colonial Treasurer, the Officers of the Treasury, and all persons whosoever concerned or engaged in making the said withdrawals or payments, are hereby indemnified and held harmless for and in respect of the withdrawal and expenditure of the said sum of Six hundred and twenty-five thousand six hundred and eleven pounds one shilling and fourpence.

Short title.

5. This Act may be cited as the "Supply and Indemnity Act 1889."

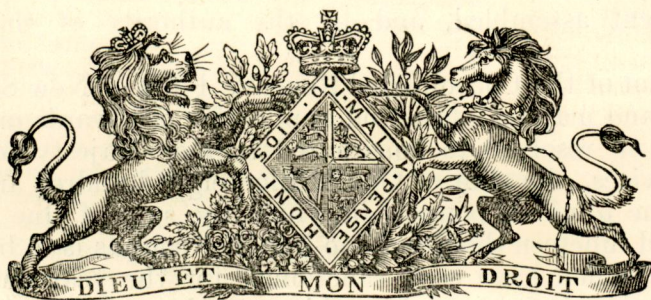

An Act to apply certain Sums out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales, towards the Services of the Year 1889; and to indemnify the Colonial Treasurer, the Officers of the Treasury, and other Public Officers, in respect of certain unauthorized advances from the Public Account of the Colonial Treasurer in the Associated Banks.

**W**HEREAS we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects Preamble.  
the Members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, have resolved to grant to Your Majesty the sum of One million eight hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred 5 pounds, that is to say—

10 The sum of One million six hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred pounds, being the sum required to defray the expenses of the various Departments and Services of the Colony for the months of January, February, and March, or following month of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine. And

The sum of Two hundred thousand pounds for the Service set forth in the First Schedule hereto:

15 And whereas we desire to make good out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales the sum so granted to Her Majesty: And whereas certain sums of money have been withdrawn from the Public Account

Account of the Colonial Treasurer in the Associated Banks without the authority of Parliament for the purpose of paying the claims of contractors and others in anticipation of the sanction of Parliament, which said sums are shown in the Second Schedule hereto, and amount to the sum of Six hundred and twenty-five thousand six hundred and eleven pounds one shilling and fourpence : And whereas the respective sums so withdrawn and payments so made were necessary to carry on and maintain the Public Service : And whereas it is expedient to indemnify all persons concerned or engaged in the matter of such withdrawals or payments. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

£1,819,100 may be issued out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

1. Out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales there shall and may be issued and applied for or towards making good the supply so resolved to be granted to Her Majesty for the said several Services, the sum of One Million eight hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred pounds, of which the sum of One million six hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred pounds is to be expended at the rates which have been sanctioned for the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, subject to the rate of any reduction that may hereafter be made in the expenditure of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and Two hundred thousand pounds for the Service specified in the First Schedule hereto.

Treasurer to pay under Governor's Warrant or Order.

2. The Treasurer shall issue and pay the said sum for the Services aforesaid in such manner and in such proportions as the Governor, by Warrants or Orders in writing under his hand and directed to the said Treasurer, shall from time to time order and direct. And the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony.

Treasurer to have credit and receipts to discharge him.

3. The Treasurer shall, in his accounts from time to time, be allowed credit for all sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such Warrants or Orders. And the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be full and valid discharges to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for such sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

Indemnity to Colonial Treasurer and his Officers, &c.

4. The Colonial Treasurer, the Officers of the Treasury, and all persons whosoever concerned or engaged in making the said withdrawals or payments, are hereby indemnified and held harmless for and in respect of the withdrawal and expenditure of the said sum of Six hundred and twenty-five thousand six hundred and eleven pounds one shilling and fourpence.

Short title.

5. This Act may be cited as the "Supply and Indemnity Act 1889."

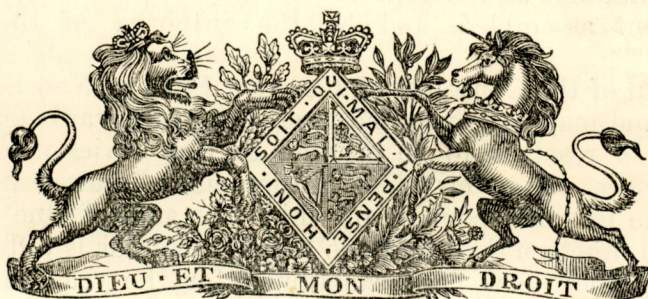

An Act to apply certain Sums out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales, towards the Services of the Year 1889; and to indemnify the Colonial Treasurer, the Officers of the Treasury, and other Public Officers, in respect of certain unauthorized advances from the Public Account of the Colonial Treasurer in the Associated Banks.

**W**HEREAS we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects Preamble.  
the Members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, have resolved to grant to Your Majesty the sum of One million eight hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred 5 pounds, that is to say—

10 The sum of One million six hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred pounds, being the sum required to defray the expenses of the various Departments and Services of the Colony for the months of January, February, and March, or following month of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine. And

The sum of Two hundred thousand pounds for the Service set forth in the First Schedule hereto:

15 And whereas we desire to make good out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales the sum so granted to Her Majesty: And whereas certain sums of money have been withdrawn from the Public Account

Account of the Colonial Treasurer in the Associated Banks without the authority of Parliament for the purpose of paying the claims of contractors and others in anticipation of the sanction of Parliament, which said sums are shown in the Second Schedule hereto, and amount to the sum of Six hundred and twenty-five thousand six hundred and eleven pounds one shilling and fourpence: And whereas the respective sums so withdrawn and payments so made were necessary to carry on and maintain the Public Service: And whereas it is expedient to indemnify all persons concerned or engaged in the matter of such withdrawals or payments. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

£1,819,100 may be issued out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

1. Out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales there shall and may be issued and applied for or towards making good the supply so resolved to be granted to Her Majesty for the said several Services, the sum of One Million eight hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred pounds, of which the sum of One million six hundred and nineteen thousand one hundred pounds is to be expended at the rates which have been sanctioned for the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, subject to the rate of any reduction that may hereafter be made in the expenditure of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and Two hundred thousand pounds for the Service specified in the First Schedule hereto.

Treasurer to pay under Governor's Warrant or Order.

2. The Treasurer shall issue and pay the said sum for the Services aforesaid in such manner and in such proportions as the Governor, by Warrants or Orders in writing under his hand and directed to the said Treasurer, shall from time to time order and direct. And the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony.

Treasurer to have credit and receipts to discharge him.

3. The Treasurer shall, in his accounts from time to time, be allowed credit for all sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such Warrants or Orders. And the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be full and valid discharges to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for such sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

Indemnity to Colonial Treasurer and his Officers, &c.

4. The Colonial Treasurer, the Officers of the Treasury, and all persons whatsoever concerned or engaged in making the said withdrawals or payments, are hereby indemnified and held harmless for and in respect of the withdrawal and expenditure of the said sum of Six hundred and twenty-five thousand six hundred and eleven pounds one shilling and fourpence.

Short title.

5. This Act may be cited as the "Supply and Indemnity Act 1889."
