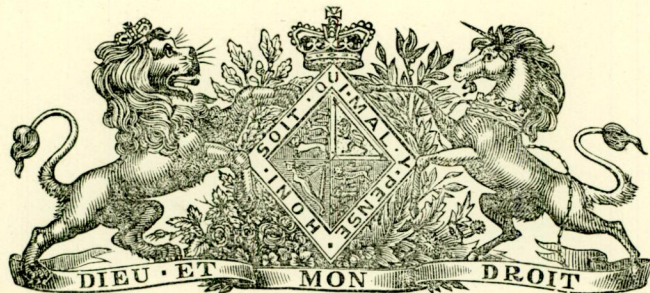

The "Vine Diseases Act, 1886," being the Act of the fiftieth Victoria numbered twenty-three, and the "Vine Diseases Act Amendment Act of 1888," being the Act of the fifty-second Victoria numbered one, both which Acts would have expired on the first day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety, shall, and they are hereby declared to, remain and continue in force up to the first day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, but no longer.

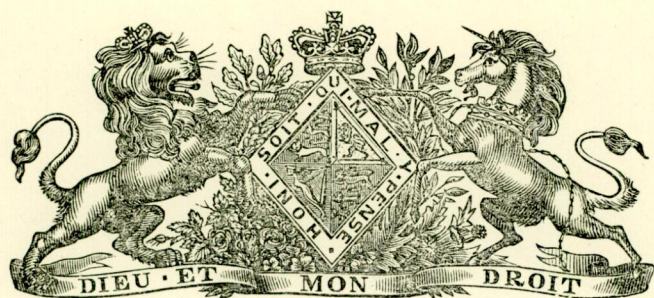
