**B**E it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5       1. The presence of twenty Members of the Legislative Council, exclusive of the President, shall at every sitting of the House, and the presence of sixteen Members, exclusive of the Chairman shall, at every sitting in Committee of the Whole, be sufficient to constitute a Quorum for the despatch of business—anything in the eighth section of the  
10 "Constitution Act" notwithstanding.

necessary to constitute a quorum in the Legislative  
Council.

THE Bill is entitled by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, in and  
with the advice and consent of the Privy Council, that all  
Legislative Councils of the South African Republic shall be  
constituted and shall continue to be constituted, until the  
passing of this Bill, in accordance with the provisions of the  
Consolidated Act, and that the number of members of the  
Legislative Council shall be increased from the number of  
members provided for in the Consolidated Act to the number  
provided for in this Bill, and that the provisions of the  
Consolidated Act shall apply to the Legislative Council as if  
the number of members thereof were the number provided for  
in this Bill.
