A BILL

To amend the "Constitution Act" in respect of the number necessary to constitute a Quorum in the Legislative Council.

[SIR ALFRED STEPHEN ;—28 *November*, 1889.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- 5 1. The presence of twenty Members of the Legislative Council, exclusive of the President, shall at every sitting of the House, and the presence of sixteen Members, exclusive of the Chairman shall, at every sitting in Committee of the Whole, be sufficient to constitute a Quorum for the despatch of business—anything in the eighth section of the

A BILL

To amend the "Constitution Act" in respect of the number
necessarily to constitute a Quorum in the Legislative

[This Bill was introduced on 22 November, 1880.]

Enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and
House of Representatives of New South Wales, in Parliament
assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—
1. The number of members of the Legislative Council shall
be twenty, and shall at any time of the Council, and the
majority of a quorum shall be ten, and the members shall
be elected in accordance with the provisions of the
Constitution Act, and shall hold office for the period of
three years, and shall be eligible for re-election.

To amend the Constitution Act in regard to the number
of members to constitute a Quorum in the Legislative
Council.

The Senate, January 22, 1874.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and
with the advice and consent of the Senate of Canada, and
in full session of the House of Commons, that where it is
required by the provisions of any Act of the Legislature of
Canada that a certain number of members of the Senate or
of the House of Commons shall be present in order to constitute
a quorum for the purpose of the passage of any Bill, or
for the purpose of the consideration of any matter, or
for the purpose of the holding of any session of the Senate
or of the House of Commons, that the number of members
required to constitute a quorum shall be the number of members
of the Senate or of the House of Commons, as the case may be,
who are present at the time when the Bill or matter is
being considered, or the session is being held, or the
Bill is being passed, or the matter is being considered, or
the session is being held, as the case may be.
