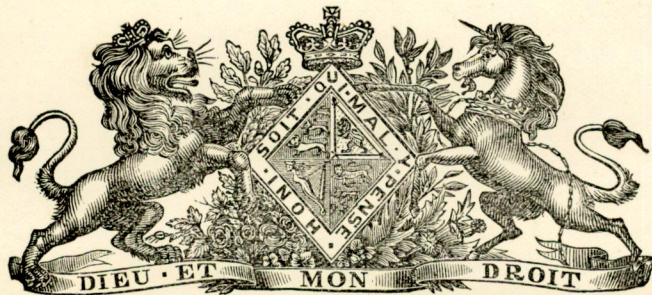

An Act to reduce the proportion of Members of the Legislative Council required to form a Quorum. [Assented to, 10th July, 1890.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. After the passing of this Act wherever in the eighth section of the Act of the Imperial Legislature, eighteenth and nineteenth Victoria chapter fifty-four (commonly known as the "Constitution Act"), the expression "one-third" occurs the expression "one-fourth" shall be substituted and read; and where in the said section the word "three" occurs the word "four" shall in like manner be substituted and read, to the intent that the quorum of the Legislative Council now prescribed by law should be one-fourth instead of one-third of the Members of the said Council, exclusive of the President.

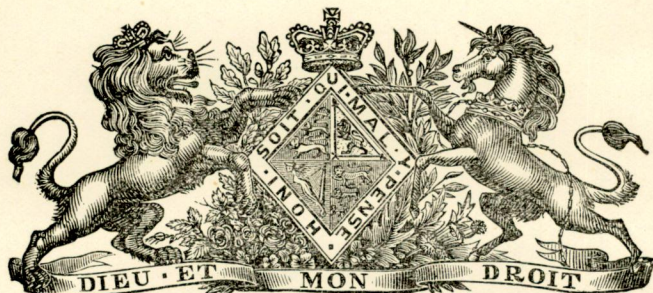
Act I.

Enacted to reduce the jurisdiction of Members of the Legislative Council required to take an Oath. [Assented to, 18th July, 1850.]

It is enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Representatives of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the said Council and House of Representatives, that

1. After the passing of this Act wherever in the eighth section of the Act of the Imperial Parliament, intituled "An Act to amend the Statute in that behalf made, intituled 'An Act for the better regulation of the Press in the Colony of New South Wales,' the words 'and to read to the members of the Council and House of Representatives of New South Wales' shall be substituted for the words 'and to read to the members of the Council and House of Representatives of New South Wales'; and where in the said section the words 'these' occur the word 'them' shall in like manner be substituted; and that the members of the Council and House of Representatives of New South Wales shall be sworn as the 'Legislative Council' and 'House of Representatives' respectively of the Colony of New South Wales; and that the words 'and to read to the members of the Council and House of Representatives of New South Wales' shall be substituted for the words 'and to read to the members of the Council and House of Representatives of New South Wales' in the said section.
