## A BILL

To prevent in certain cases the lapsing of Bills in Parliament  
by termination of the Session.

[SIR ALFRED STEPHEN ;—28 *November*, 1889.]

**B**E it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- 5       1. No Bill now pending in Parliament, or hereafter so pending, which shall have been read a second time, or the second reading of which shall have been duly moved and seconded, shall lapse because only of the termination of the existing Session before its final disposal; but such Bill may, on motion for that purpose in the next Session of  
10 the same Parliament, be taken up at the stage reached by it, and may thence be proceeded with as if the Bill had reached that stage in the lastmentioned Session.
