BIRDS PROTECTION AMENDING BILL.

(Amendments and New Clauses to be proposed in Committee of the Whole by Mr. THORNTON.)

2. The period of time between every first day of August and close season. the thirty-first day of January then next succeeding, both days inclusive; and the close season for quail shall be the period of time between every first day of October and the thirty-first day of March then next succeeding, both days inclusive: Provided that the Colonial Secretary may, by notice in the *Gazette*, vary the period of the close season for any district described in such notice whenever it shall appear to him to be expedient so to do for the better preservation of the scheduled birds, or any of them. And so much of the Act fortyfifth Victoria number twenty-nine as defines the "Close Season" is hereby repealed.
