



BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled,

And the First and Second Schedules to the said Impounding Acts. (II) This section shall be construed as one with the Impounding Act of 1865, the Impounding Act Amendment Act of 1869, the Impounding Act Amendment Act of 1879, and the Impounding Law Amendment Act of 1881.
