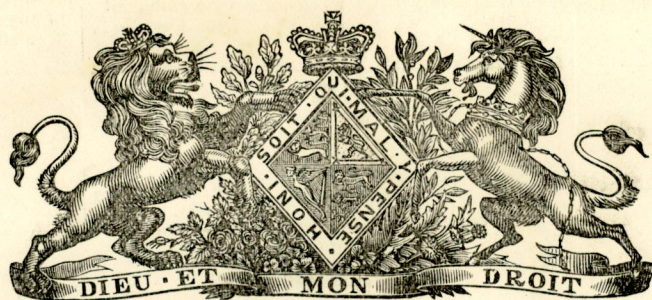

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (I) The word "cattle," wherever used in the Impounding Act of 1865, or in any Act amending the same, shall include camels and dromedaries. And the First and Second Schedules to the said Act are hereby amended by the addition to them respectively of the words and figures contained in Schedules I and II to this Act respectively.
