This Public Bill originated in the Legislative Assembly, and, having this day passed, is now ready for presentation to the Legislative Council for its concurrence.

An Act to legalize certain Conditional Purchases and Conditional Leases and Auction and other Purchases of Crown Lands, and to validate certain Crown grants in connection therewith; to confer special powers of reference to the Local Land Board and the Land Appeal Court where necessary; to permit the reversal of forfeiture of certain Conditional Purchases and Conditional Leases; to authorise the sale of certain Crown Lands and the issue of Crown grants therefor; and to authorise the granting of certain Crown Land by way of compensation.

WHEREAS the persons whose names are mentioned in Schedules Preamble.

A and B hereto have made, or applied to make, conditional purchases or conditional leases of certain Crown lands, and the said purchases or leases, or applications therefor, as the case may be,

5 have been found to be either wholly, or in part, illegal, or have been forfeited, for the causes respectively specified in the said Schedules: And whereas the persons whose names are mentioned in Schedule C hereto have purchased, or intended to purchase, at auction, certain Crown lands, but the said purchases are illegal

10 for the causes specified in the said Schedule: And whereas the sale of the land specified in Schedule D hereto is not authorised by the law: And whereas the sale and grant of the land specified in

in Schedule E hereto, which purported to have been made and issued under the provisions of section eleven of the "Crown Lands Alienation Act of 1861," were illegal: And whereas it is just and expedient that the sale of, or the respective titles to, or the applications for, the lands 5 aforementioned should be authorised or made good and valid: And whereas the sale and grant of the land specified in Schedule F hereto which purported to have been made and issued under the provisions of section two of the "Lands Acts Amendment Act of 1875" were illegal: And whereas it is desirable that the land specified in 10 Schedule G should be granted to the company therein mentioned: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled,

and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

1. The conditional purchases and conditional leases, or the validation of conapplications therefor of the lands specified and described in Schedules and leases or applications this Act by the persons whose names are respectively set cations therefor opposite to the descriptions of the said lands shall be held to have specified in Schedules A and B. been and to be valid and effectual in law, subject, nevertheless, to the

20 performance of the conditions and requirements of any law applicable thereto, except the matters included in the causes of illegality or forfeiture described in the said Schedules respectively; and where any such conditional purchases or conditional leases have been notified as forfeited the forfeiture shall be reversed, and the reversal thereof

25 shall relate back to the date of notification of such forfeiture in the Government Gazette. Upon reference by the Minister to the Local Reference to Land Land Board (as constituted under the Crown Lands Acts) of any of the Appeal Court. aforementioned applications, which at the passing of this Act have not been confirmed, such Board shall deal therewith, and if no other valid

30 objection be found to exist shall confirm the same: Provided that the provisions of the Crown Lands Acts with respect to appeals or references to the Land Appeal Court shall apply in such cases.

2. The purchase at auction of the lands specified and described Validation of purin Schedule C to this Act by, and the grants of such lands to, the persons specified in Schedule 35 whose names are set opposite to the descriptions of the said lands are c. hereby declared to have been and to be valid and effectual in law.

3. The Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may Validation of sale sell and grant the land described in Schedule D hereto to the person specified in Schedule whose name is set opposite to the description of the said land at the 40 price of fifteen pounds, and a deed fee of one pound; but if the said

money be not paid within three months after the passing of this Act the sale shall be void, and no grant shall issue in respect thereof.

4. The sale and grant of the lands specified in Schedules E Validation of sale and F to this Act are hereby declared to have been and to be valid and E and F. 45 effectual in law.

5. The Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, Validation of sale may grant the land described in Schedule G to this Act to the Australian specific in Schedule G. Gas-light Company (in the name of the secretary thereof and subject to the terms of the Australian Gas-light Company's Acts) in pursuance 50 of a proposal made in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixtyseven by the then Minister for Lands, and agreed to by the company in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight in full com-

pensation for the severance (by the reclamation of such lands) of land adjoining thereto from the waters of Woolloomooloo Bay.

6. was applied for by virtue of a conditional purchase made under section twenty-two of the "Crown Lands Alienation Act of 1861," whether the combined areas of the freehold and the conditional purchases and conditional leases of the series exceed the area limited by the Crown 5 Lands Acts for ordinary conditional purchases and conditional leases or not: No conditional lease existing at the passing of this Act shall

be held to have been or to be invalid by reason only that it was applied for by virtue of a conditional purchase of land within a special area: Provided that nothing in this section shall operate to revive any application, purchase, or lease which, prior to the passing of this Act has

10 cation, purchase, or lease which, prior to the passing of this Act has been, and at date of such passing shall stand as, disallowed, refused, withdrawn, or forfeited.

7. Provided that nothing herein shall affect any proceedings, Proviso. either at law or in equity, instituted before the thirty-first day of 15 October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

8. This Act may be cited as the "Crown Lands Purchases and Short title. Leases Validation Act of 1893."

An Act to legalize certain Conditional Purchases and Conditional Leases and Auction and other Purchases of Crown Lands, and to validate certain Crown grants in connection therewith; to confer special powers of reference to the Local Land Board and the Land Appeal Court where necessary; to permit the reversal of forfeiture of certain Conditional Purchases and Conditional Leases; to authorise the sale of certain Crown Lands and the issue of Crown grants therefor; and to authorise the granting of certain Crown Land by way of compensation.

THEREAS the persons whose names are mentioned in Schedules Preamble. A and B hereto have made, or applied to make, conditional purchases or conditional leases of certain Crown lands, and the said purchases or conditional leases of certain Crown lands, and the said purchases or leases, or applications therefor, as the case may be, 5 have been found to be either wholly, or in part, illegal, or have been forfeited, for the causes respectively specified in the said Schedules: And whereas the persons whose names are mentioned in Schedule C hereto have purchased, or intended to purchase, at auction, certain Crown lands, but the said purchases are illegal 10 for the causes specified in the said Schedules. And whereas the 10 for the causes specified in the said Schedule: And whereas the sale of the land specified in Schedule D hereto is not authorised by the law: And whereas the sale and grant of the land specified 112-A

in Schedule E hereto, which purported to have been made and issued under the provisions of section eleven of the "Crown Lands Alienation Act of 1861," were illegal: And whereas it is just and expedient that the sale of, or the respective titles to, or the applications for, the lands 5 aforementioned should be authorised or made good and valid: And whereas the sale and grant of the land specified in Schedule F hereto which purported to have been made and issued under the provisions of section two of the "Lands Acts Amendment Act of 1875" were illegal: And whereas it is desirable that the land specified in 10 Schedule G should be granted to the company therein mentioned: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled,

- 7. Provided that nothing herein shall affect any proceedings, Proviso. either at law or in equity, instituted before the thirty-first day of 15 October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.
 - 8. This Act may be cited as the "Crown Lands Purchases and Short title. Leases Validation Act of 1893."
