THEREAS it is expedient to amend the "Government Railways Preamble. Act of 1888" in respect of certain contracts to be made by the Commissioners appointed under that Act: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and con-5 sent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :-

After the passing of this Act, which may be cited as the Certain contracts of "Government Railways (Contracts) Amendment Act of 1891," the the Commissioners 10 Railway Commissioners of New South Wales shall not enter into any without the contract pursuant to the powers granted by the forty-seventh section Governor's consent. of the "Government Railways Act of 1888," in any case, where such contract is for the supply either directly, or indirectly, from places outside New South Wales, of materials, locomotive engines, or other

15 motive or tractive power, and, where such contract exceeds the sum of twenty thousand pounds, or-of-any-other-matter-or-thing, without the consent of the Governor.
