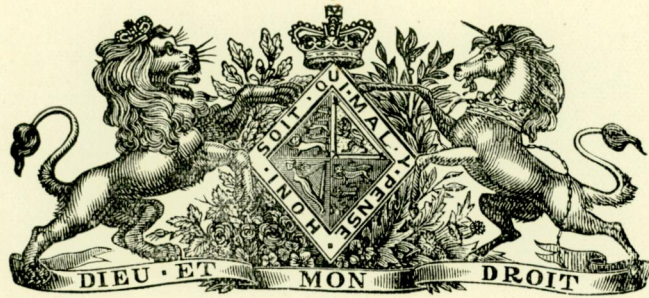

4. The fees to be paid to the Registrar-General and his clerks for their services as such Commissioners are hereby abolished.
