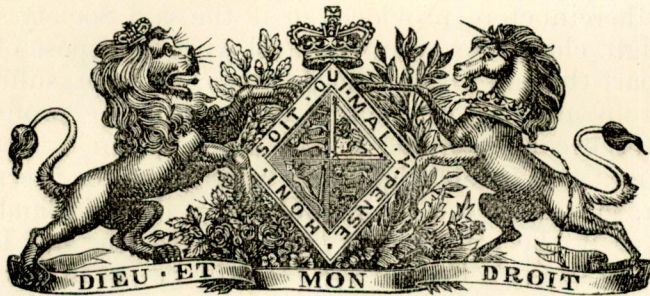

An Act to continue the vesting of certain land in the Agricultural Society of New South Wales subject to certain conditions, and to suspend all rights of common in respect of such land. [Assented to, 30th April, 1894.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to continue the provisions of the Act Preamble. fifty-sixth Victoria number eight, being "*An Act to temporarily vest certain land in the Royal Agricultural Society of New South Wales with certain powers and subject to certain conditions, and to suspend certain rights of common in respect of the part so vested*": Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The land described in the Schedule to the Act fifty-sixth Victoria number eight shall, subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, vest in the Agricultural Society of New South Wales (in the said Act referred to as the Royal Agricultural Society of New South Wales) for a period of twenty-one years from and after the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and all rights of common in respect of the said lands are hereby suspended during such period.

Land described in Schedule to 56 Vic. No. 8 to vest in the Agricultural Society of New South Wales for 21 years from 30th June, 1894.

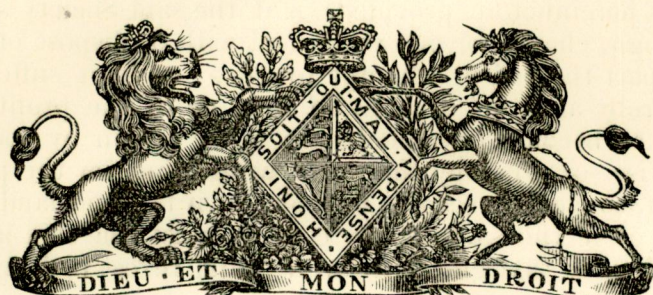

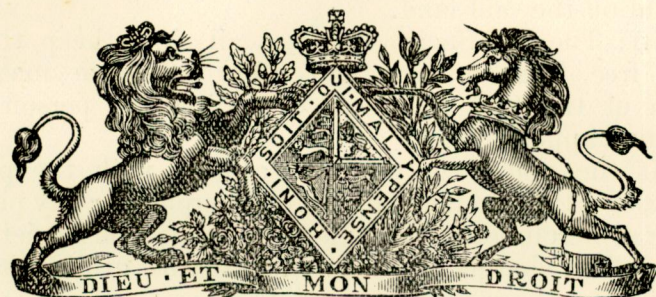

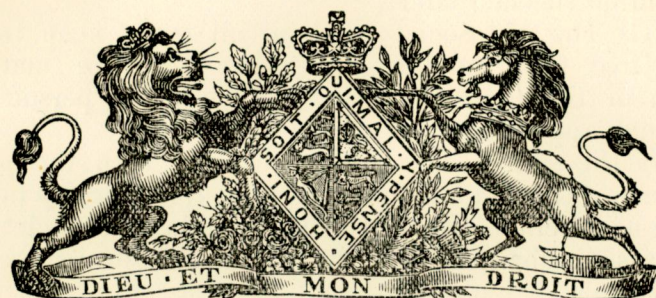
