WHEREAS the "Vine Disease Act of 1888," as amended by the "Vine Disease Act Amendment Act of 1889," will expire on the 31st day of March 1890, and it is expedient to continue the said Acts for a further period of one year; and whereas the said Acts were passed by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Her Majesty's first Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—
