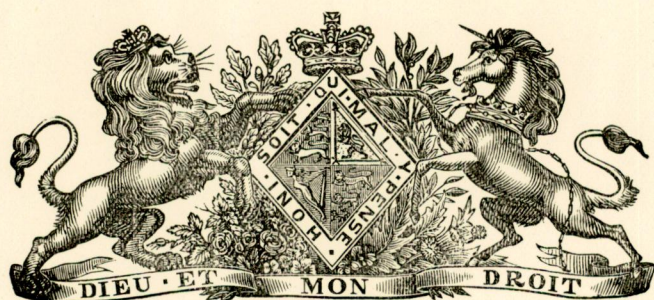

An Act to repeal the "Agreements Validating Act," and to make provision for continuance of agreements lawfully made thereunder before the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- 5 1. On and from the first day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, the "Agreements Validating Act," being the Act of the thirty-ninth Victoria number twenty-nine, shall be repealed: Provided that notwithstanding such repeal every agreement lawfully entered into pursuant to the said Act before the
10 first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, shall have the like validity and binding force on the parties thereto, and shall be accompanied by the like rights and remedies for all purposes, as if this Act had not been passed.

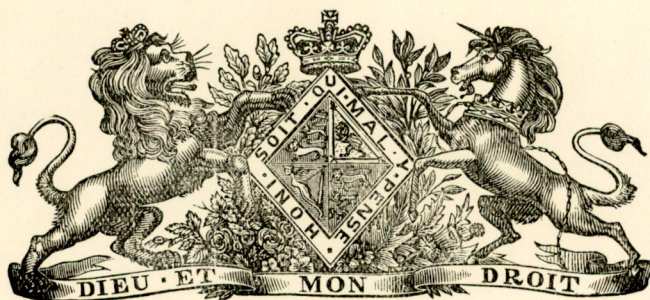

An Act to repeal the "Agreement's Validating Act," and to make provision for continuance of agreements lawfully made thereunder before the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.

Enacted by the Queen, Her Excellency the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the Chief Justice and Council of the Legislative Council and Senate in Assembly at New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the Senate, as follows:—

1. On and from the first day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, the "Agreement's Validating Act," so far as it relates to the continuation of agreements lawfully made thereunder, shall be repealed: Provided that notwithstanding such repeal every agreement lawfully entered into pursuant to the said Act before the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, shall have the force and binding force on the parties thereto and shall be so deemed by the law and courts for all purposes, as if the Act had not been passed.
