

An Act to amend the "Labour Settlements Act" and the "Labour Settlements Act Amendment Act of 1894."

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :--

1. Notwithstanding anything in the Acts hereby amended, Further advances "Labour Settlements Act" and the "Labour Settlements Act Amend-ment Act of 1894," the Minister for Lands may recommend to be paid to any Board of Control established thereunder, and the Colonial 5

Treasurer may, from any moneys voted for the purpose, pay to that 10 Board, to be held and applied as prescribed in the Labour Settlements Act, any amounts the Minister may deem necessary or expedient, subject to the following limitations :-

(a) The aggregate amounts paid under the authority of the said Acts and of this Act and-of-the-Acts hereby-amended shall not exceed in respect of each enrolled member-

- (I) Who is head of a family dependent upon him-seventyfive pounds.
- (II) Who is a married person without a family dependent upon him—sixty pounds.
- (III) Who is an unmarried person over the age of twentyonle years (which term includes a balchelor, a spinster, a widower, or a widow)-forty-five pounds : 105-
