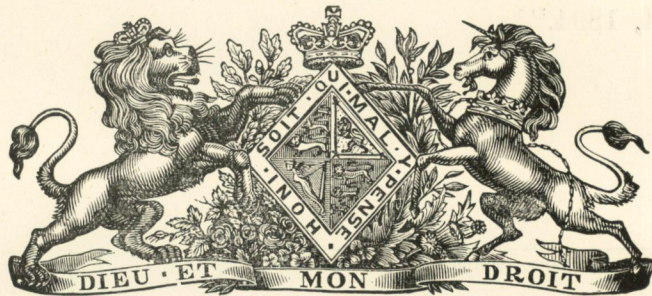

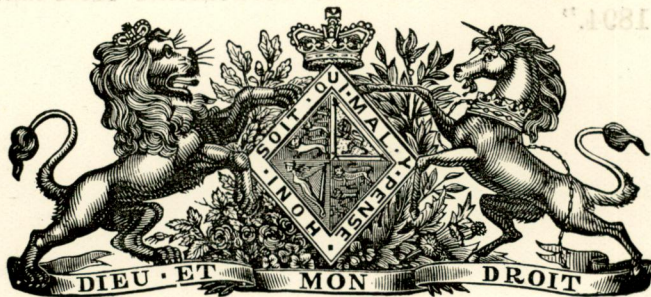

Enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding anything in the "Labour Settlements Act" or the "Labour Settlements Act Amendment Act of 1894" the Minister for Lands may, in his discretion, pay to any person who is entitled to a Labour Settlement, or to the person to whom the same may be transferred, any money which may be due to him in respect of the same, and may apply the same in the discharge of any debt or liability of the person to whom the same may be transferred, or in the discharge of any other liability of the person to whom the same may be transferred, or in the discharge of any other liability of the person to whom the same may be transferred.

2. The aggregate amount paid under the authority of the said Act and of the Act amended by this Act shall not exceed in respect of any one person, in any one year, the amount of five pounds.

(1) Who is head of a family dependent upon him—seven pounds.

(ii) Who is a married person without a family dependent upon him—six pounds.

(iii) Who is an unmarried person over the age of twenty-one years (which term includes a bachelor, a spinster, a widow, or a widow)—five pounds.

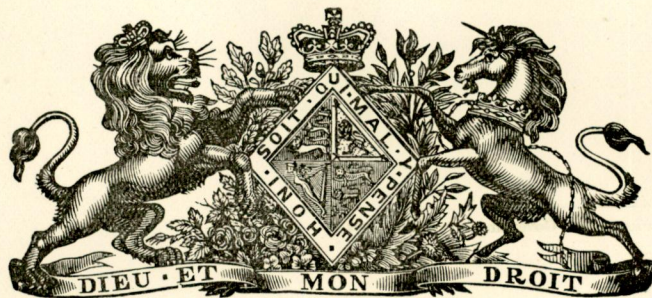
