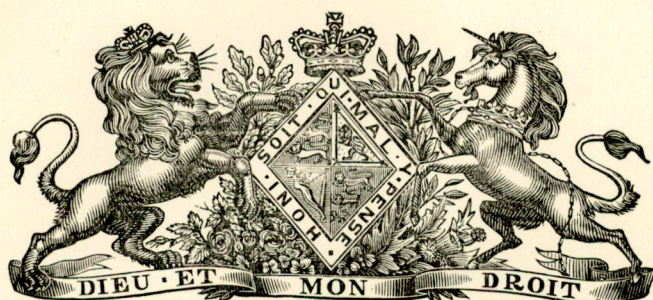

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. Subsection (v) of section forty-four of the "Parliamentary Electorates and Elections Act of 1893" is hereby amended by inserting the words "once in some newspaper published or circulating in the Division when and as soon as practicable not being less than a period of twenty-one days prior to the holding of the Revision Court" in place of the words "twice at least and if time permits four times in some newspaper or newspapers published or circulating in the Division" contained in that subsection.

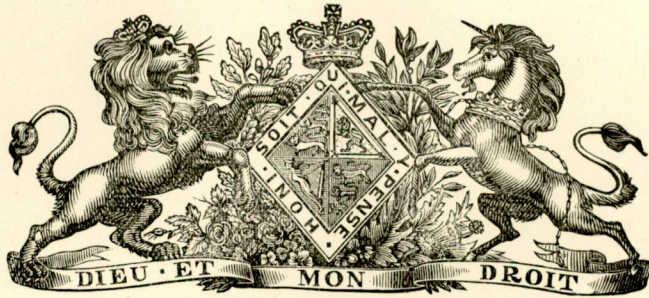

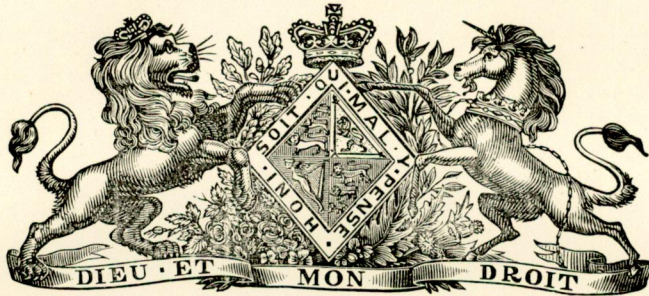
