On and after the commencement of this Act, upon receipt $_{\text{Flying foxes}}$ of a petition in that behalf from the Pastures and Stock Protection $_{\text{declared to be}}^{\text{declared to be}}$ Board of any of the districts named in the Schedule hereto, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by proclamation in the *Gazette*, to declare flying foxes noxious animals within the meaning of the Acts aforesaid within any such district.


