

RANDWICK CEMETERY BILL.

SCHEDULE of Amendment referred to in Message of 30th May, 1895.

Page 1, clause 1. At end of clause *add* “except in any case where there is on such
“day an exclusive right of interment in any vault or enclosure in the
“said cemetery, purchased or acquired, in which any body intended to
“be interred shall be encased in a leaden coffin, the lead weighing not
“less than six pounds to the square foot.”

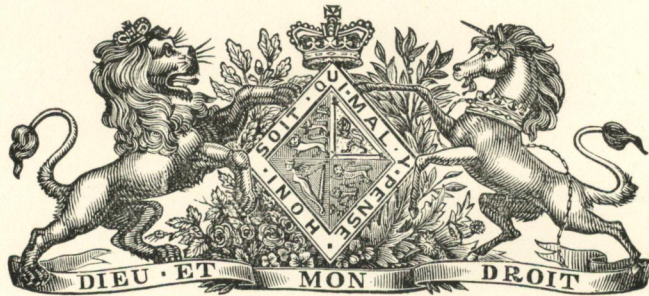

An Act to repeal so much of the "Camperdown and Randwick Cemeteries Act of 1867" as relates to the Randwick Cemetery and to the interment of bodies therein, and to prohibit burials in the said Cemetery.

WHEREAS by the "Camperdown and Randwick Cemeteries Act Preamble.
of 1867" provision is made for the interment in certain cases
of bodies in the burial ground known as the Randwick Cemetery:
And whereas it is expedient in the interests of the public health that
5 burials in the said burial ground should be discontinued except as
hereinafter provided: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most
Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the
Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in
Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—
10 1. On and after the first day of July next all burials in the
burial ground known as the Randwick Cemetery shall be discontinued,
except in any case where there is on such day an exclusive right of
interment in any vault or enclosure in the said cemetery purchased or
acquired in which any body intended to be interred shall be encased in
15 a leaden coffin, the lead weighing not less than six pounds to the square
foot.

Interments to be discontinued after a particular day, except in certain cases.

Randwick Cemetery.

2. Any person who after the date aforesaid knowingly and wilfully buries any body or in anywise acts or assists in the burial of any body in the said burial ground contrary to the provisions of this Act shall be liable to a penalty of one hundred pounds, to be recovered in a summary way before a Stipendiary Magistrate or any two Justices of the Peace.

Penalty for disobedience.

3. So much of the "Camperdown and Randwick Cemeteries Act of 1867" as relates to the said burial ground and to the interment of bodies therein is, from the first day of July next, hereby repealed.

Camperdown and Randwick Cemeteries Act of 1867 repealed in part.

10 4. This Act may be cited as the "Randwick Cemetery Act, 1895."

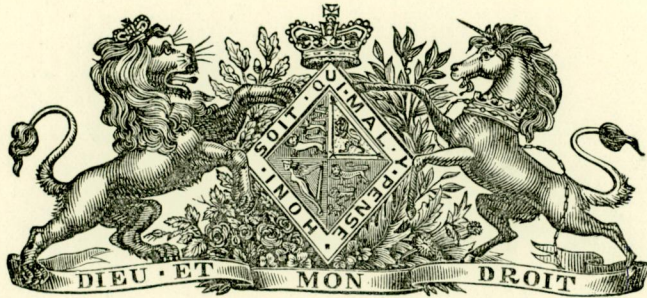

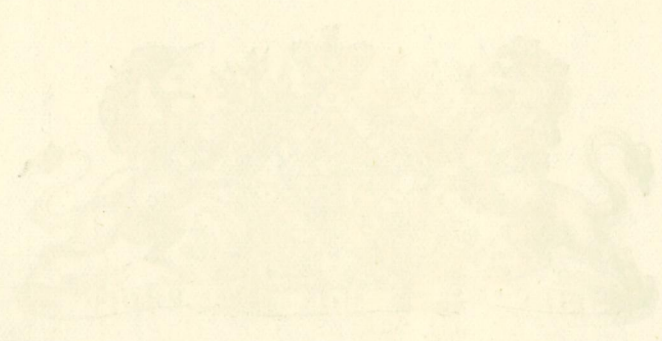
