WHEREAS it is expedient to establish a standard of time in New Preamble. South Wales, and to declare the mean time of the one hundred and fiftieth meridian of longitude east of Greenwich in England to be such standard time throughout New South Wales: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-


1. This Act may be cited as "The Standard Time Act of 1894." Short title.
