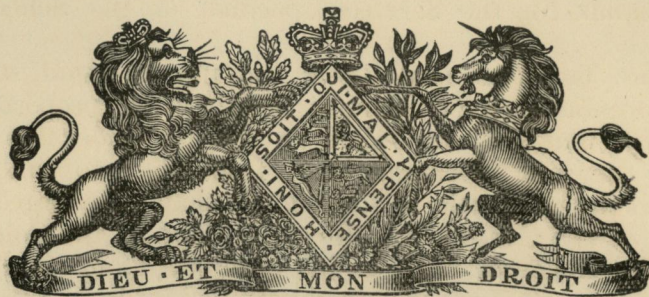

VICTORIÆ REGINÆ.

No. I. (A.D. 1897.)

An Act to apply certain sums out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales towards the Services of the Year 1897-8; a Service of the current year; and for Services to be hereafter provided for by Loan. [Assented to, 17th May, 1897.]

WHEREAS we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects Preamble. the Members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, have resolved to grant to Your Majesty the sum of Two millions and seventy-nine thousand six hundred pounds, that is to say—

The sum of One million five hundred and sixteen thousand five hundred pounds, being the sum required to defray the expenses of the various Departments and Services of the Colony during the months of July, August, and September, or following month of the financial year ending thirtieth June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight. And

The sum of Five hundred and sixty-three thousand one hundred pounds for the Services set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed:

And whereas we desire to make good out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales the sum so granted to Her Majesty: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with

Consolidated Revenue Fund.

with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

£2,079,600 may be issued out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

1. Out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales there shall and may be issued and applied for or towards making good the supply so resolved to be granted to Her Majesty for the said several Services, the sum of Two millions and seventy-nine thousand six hundred pounds, of which the sum of One million five hundred and sixteen thousand five hundred pounds is to be expended at the rates which have been sanctioned for the financial year ending thirtieth June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, subject to the rate of any reduction that may hereafter be made in the expenditure of the year 1897-1898, and Five hundred and sixty-three thousand one hundred pounds for the Services specified in the Schedule hereto annexed.

Treasurer to pay under Governor's Warrant or Order.

2. The Treasurer shall issue and pay the said sum for the Services aforesaid in such manner and in such proportions as the Governor, by Warrants or Orders in writing under his hand, and directed to the said Treasurer, shall from time to time order and direct. And the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony.

Treasurer to have credit and receipts to discharge him.

3. The Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for all sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such Warrants or Orders. And the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be full and valid discharges to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for such sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

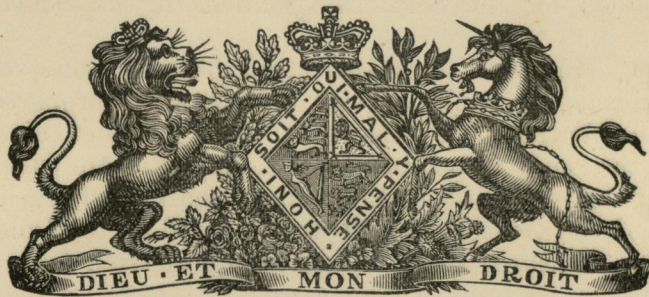

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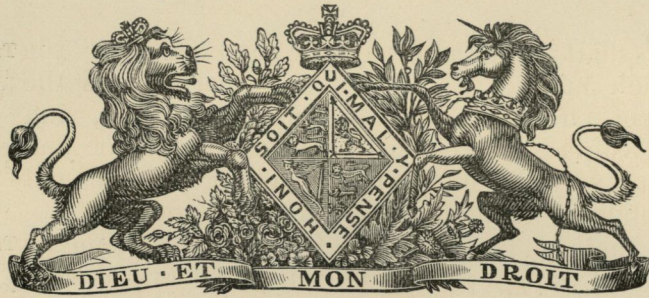

with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. Out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales £2,079,600 may be issued out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund.
- 5 there shall and may be issued and applied for or towards making good the supply so resolved to be granted to Her Majesty for the said several Services, the sum of Two millions and seventy-nine thousand six hundred pounds, of which the sum of One million five hundred and sixteen thousand five hundred pounds is to be expended at the rates
- 10 which have been sanctioned for the financial year ending thirtieth June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, subject to the rate of any reduction that may hereafter be made in the expenditure of the year 1897-1898, and Five hundred and sixty-three thousand one hundred pounds for the Services specified in the Schedule hereto
- 15 annexed.
2. The Treasurer shall issue and pay the said sum for the Services aforesaid in such manner and in such proportions as the Governor, by Warrants or Orders in writing under his hand, and directed to the said Treasurer, shall from time to time order and
- 20 direct. And the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony. Treasurer to pay under Governor's Warrant or Order.
3. The Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for all sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such Warrants or Orders. And the receipts of the respective persons to
- 25 whom the same shall be so paid shall be full and valid discharges to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for such sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly. Treasurer to have credit and receipts to discharge him.
