An Act to amend the Hay Irrigation Act and to repeal the Hay Irrigation Act Amendment Act, 1895. [Assented to, 13th November, 1896.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) The Governor may, by notification in the Gazette, appoint Reconstitution of six persons, as follows:—

Hay Irrigation Trust.

(a) Three persons resident in the Land District of Hay; and(b) three officers of the Public Service,

as members of the Hay Irrigation Trust; and the said persons and their successors shall constitute the body corporate of the Hay Irrigation Trust.

The trust so constituted, and the members thereof, shall have the powers conferred, and be subject to the liabilities imposed on the Hay Irrigation Trust and the members thereof respectively by the

Hay Irrigation Act, or heretofore incurred under that Act.

(II) The first appointment as aforesaid of members of the trust shall be made as soon as practicable after this Act takes effect, and thereupon the council of the municipal district of Hay for the time being shall cease to be the body authorised to carry out the Hay Irrigation Act.

(III) If the Governor shall at any time deem it expedient that any person should cease to be a member of the trust, the Governor may call upon such person to resign or may remove him from the trust.
