BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. From and after the first day of January, one thousand eight Grant of Land Tax. hundred and ninety-six, there shall be annually assessed, levied, and paid under the provisions of, and subject to the exemptions and deductions enacted in the Land and Income Tax Assessment Act of 1895, and in the manner therein prescribed, a land tax of one penny in the pound of the unimproved value of all lands as in the said Act specified.
