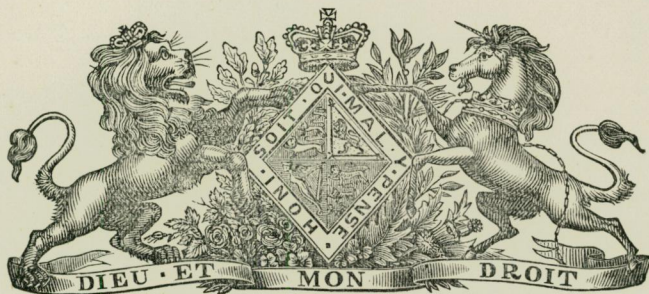

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

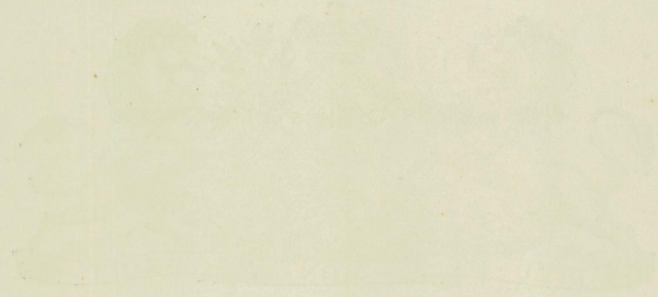
1. Sections two and four of the Act fifty-sixth Victoria number thirty-five are hereby amended by substituting the words "six years" for the words "three years" wherever they occur in the said sections. Amendment of sections 2 and 4 of 56 Vic. No. 35.

No breach of any of the conditions specified in those sections respectively committed before the commencement of this Act shall be deemed to have had or to have the effect of re-vesting in the Railway Commissioners of New South Wales any of the lands in those sections respectively mentioned, but the said lands shall, notwithstanding any breach as aforesaid, be deemed to have remained vested in the trustees referred to in those sections respectively, subject to the conditions and trusts set forth in the Act fifty-sixth Victoria number thirty-five as hereby amended.

2. This Act may be cited as the "Newcastle Friendly Societies and Trades Hall Act Amendment Act, 1896." Short title.

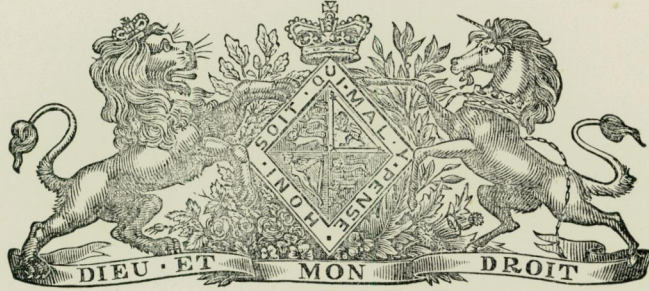

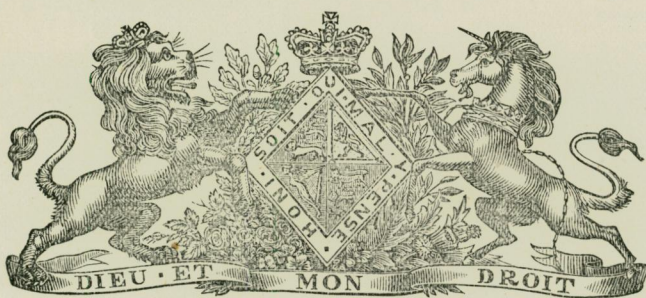

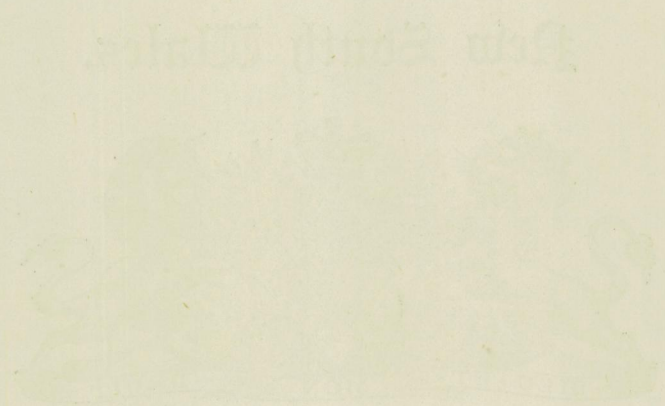
