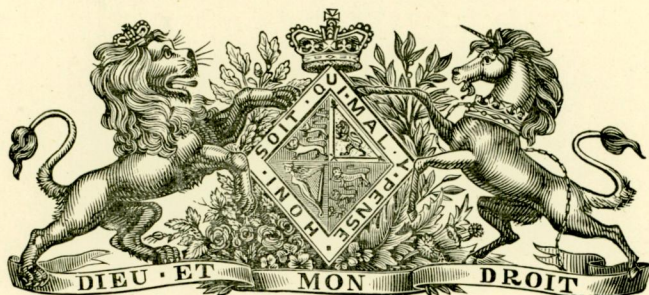

An Act to extend the time for polling at Parliamentary Elections. [Assented to, 8th July, 1898.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

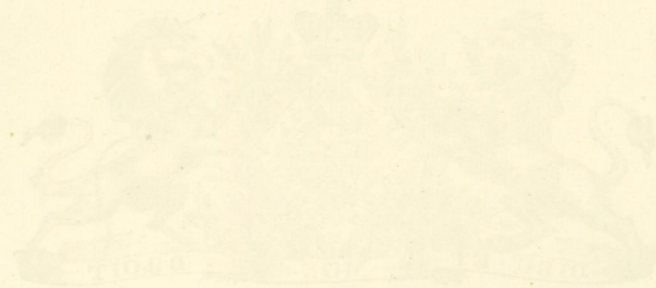
1. Section seventy-nine of the Parliamentary Electorates and Elections Act of 1893 (56 Vic. No. 38) is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof it is enacted that every polling shall commence on the day appointed for the same at eight o'clock in the forenoon, and shall, unless lawfully adjourned, finally close at six o'clock in the afternoon of the same day. Hours of polling at parliamentary elections.

2. This Act may be cited as the "Parliamentary Elections (Polling) Act, 1898." Short title.

Act No. 2, 1898

An Act to extend the time for holding a Parliamentary Election. [Assented to, 8th July, 1898.]

BE it enacted by His Majesty that a provision whereby by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Representatives of New South Wales Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the said Parliament:

1. Section 26 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia and the Constitution of New South Wales shall be amended, and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following words, to-wit:—
"The House of Representatives shall be summoned for the first time at least six months before the expiration of the term of the Parliament then existing."

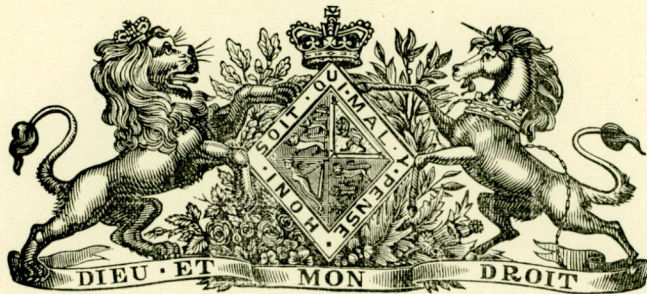
2. This Act may be cited as the "Parliamentary Elections Act, 1898."

Enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. Section seventy-nine of the Parliamentary Elections and Elections Act of 1850 (No. 7, 1851) is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof it is enacted that every polling shall commence on the day appointed for the same at eight o'clock in the morning, and shall unless lawfully adjourned, terminate at six o'clock in the afternoon of the same day.

2. This Act may be cited as the Parliamentary Elections Act, 1858.

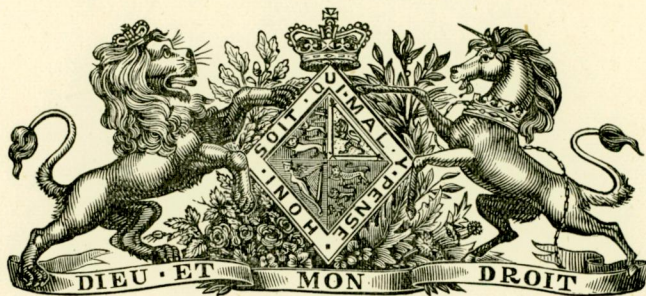
