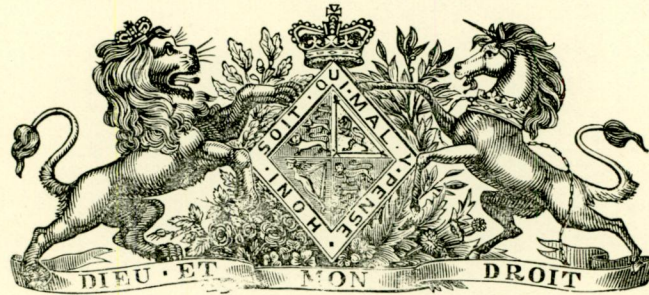

Act No. 30, 1899.

An Act to fix certain Public Holidays on Mondays.
[Assented to, 1st December, 1899.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. When any of the following days, that is to say, the twenty-sixth day of January, the anniversary of the birthday of Her Majesty or Her successor, the first day of August, or the anniversary of the birthday of the Prince of Wales, falls on any day of the week other than Monday, that day shall not be a Bank Holiday, but the following Monday shall be a Bank Holiday in lieu thereof unless otherwise proclaimed by notice in the Government Gazette; and the Fourth Schedule to the Banks and Bank Holidays Act, 1898, is hereby amended accordingly.

When certain days declared to be Bank Holidays do not fall on a Monday the following Monday to be a Bank Holiday instead.

2. This Act may be cited as the "Banks and Bank Holidays Act Amendment Act, 1899." Short title.

BY APPOINTMENT TO HIS MAJESTY THE KING

VICTORIA REGINA

Act No. 30, 1890

An Act to amend the Public Holidays Act, 1887, and to provide for the observance of the Public Holidays, 1890.

Enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Privy Council, in pursuance of the recommendation of the Honorable the Members of the Executive Council, and by the authority of the Senate of the said Colony.

1. Where any of the following days, that is to say, the 1st day of January, the anniversary of the birthday of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, the 1st day of August, the anniversary of the birthday of the Queen of Wales, falls on any day of the week other than Monday, that day shall not be a Public Holiday, but the following day shall be a Public Holiday, unless the day immediately preceding the said day shall be a Public Holiday, and the Public Holiday shall be observed on the day immediately preceding the said day.

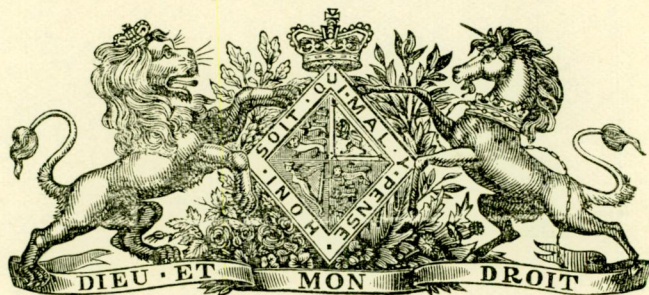
2. This Act may be cited as the "Public and Bank Holidays Act, 1890."

2. This Act may be cited as the "Banks and Bank Holidays Act Amendment Act, 1899." Short title.

THE LEGISLATIVE

ARTICLE I

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature of the State in which they may be, for six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 4. The Times, Places and Manner of holding the Elections of Senators and Representatives, shall be prescribed in each State by the Legislature thereof; but the Congress may at any time by Law alter or add to the Rules and Regulations of the Election of Senators and Representatives.

Section 5. The Congress shall assemble at least once in every Year, and such Meeting shall begin on the first Monday in December, but they may by Law alter the Day of the Commencement of these regular Sessions, provided that one Session shall at least be held annually.

Section 6. The Senators and Representatives shall receive a Compensation for their Services, to be ascertained from Time to Time by each House of Representatives. They shall, in all Cases, except Treason, Felony and Breach of the Peace, be privileged from Arrest during their Attendance at the Session of their respective Houses, and in going to and returning from the same; and for any Speech or Debate in either House they shall not be liable to any Question or Punishment.

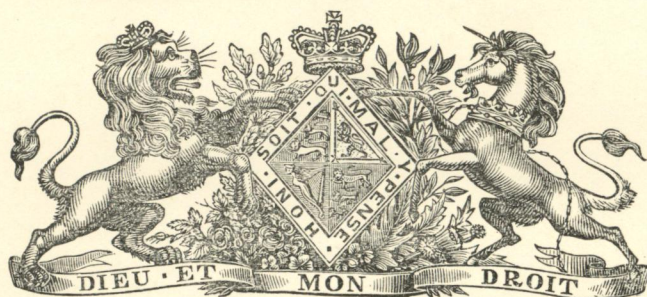
