When any of the following days, that is to say, the twenty- When certain days sixth day of January, the anniversary of the birthday of Her Majesty declared to be Bank Holidays do not fall or Her successor, the first day of August, or the anniversary of the on a Monday the birthday of the Prince of Wales, falls on any day of the week other following Monday than Monday, that day shall not be a Bank Holiday, but the following instead. Monday shall be a Bank Holiday in lieu thereof unless otherwise proclaimed by notice in the Government Gazette; and the Fourth Schedule to the Banks and Bank Holidays Act, 1898, is hereby amended accordingly.


2. This Act may be cited as the "Banks and Bank Holidays Act short title. Amendment Act, 1899."
