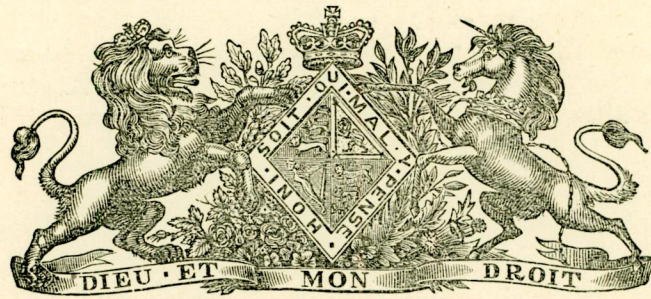

Act No. 84, 1900.

An Act to provide for the redistribution of New South Wales into electoral districts ; and for purposes consequent upon or incidental to that object. [Assented to, 11th December, 1900.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act shall be construed with the Parliamentary Electorates and Elections Act of 1893 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Act), and any Act amending the same, and may be cited as the "Parliamentary Electorates Redistribution Act, 1900." Incorporation and short title.

2. The following persons, namely, His Honor Judge Murray, Commissioners appointed. R. C. Critchett Walker, Esquire, C.M.G., and Colin J. McMaster, Esquire, are hereby appointed commissioners for the redistribution of New South Wales into electoral districts.

3. It shall be the duty of such commissioners, and they are hereby directed to redistribute New South Wales into electoral districts within three months after the commencement of this Act; and the provisions of the Principal Act relating to any distribution of New South Wales into electoral districts, and the forming of the rolls for the newly-constituted districts, and any matters consequent on such distribution, shall apply to and in relation to the distribution directed by this Act to be made; and the quota for the distribution shall be ascertained by dividing by one hundred and twenty-five the total number of electors on the rolls in force with a discretionary margin of allowance of six hundred electors:

Proviso.

Provided that the commissioners' report shall be submitted by the Minister for the approval of the Legislative Assembly within fourteen days after the commencement of the next session of Parliament.

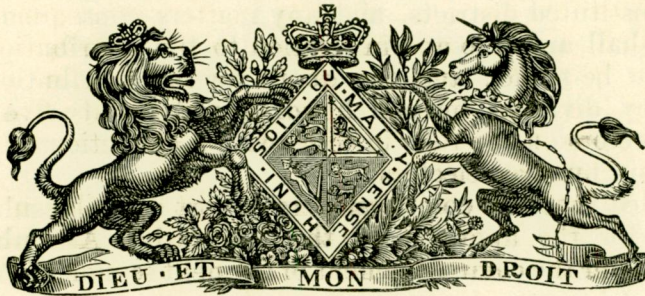

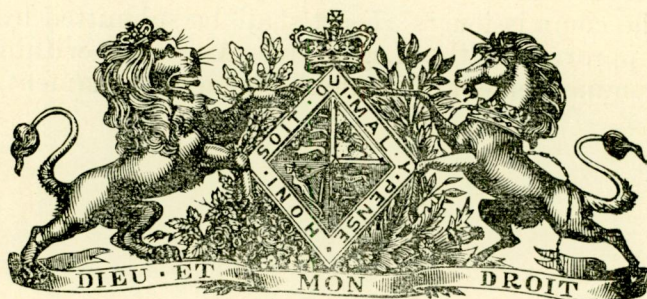
