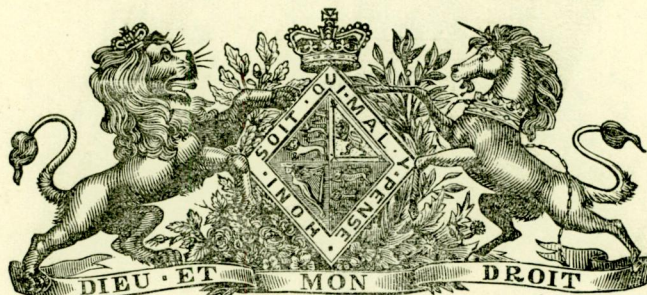

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Pastures and Stock Protection (Rabbit) Act, 1900." Short title.

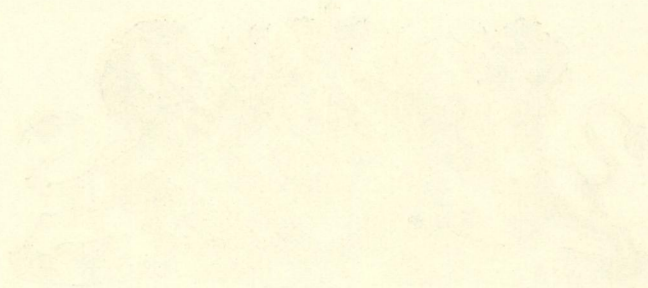
2. The expression "noxious animals" in the Pastures and Stock Protection Act, 1898, shall include rabbits. Noxious animals to include rabbits.

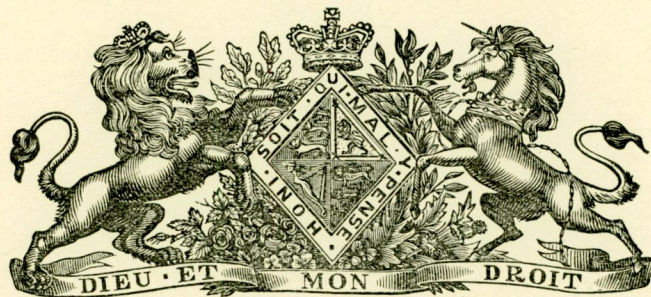

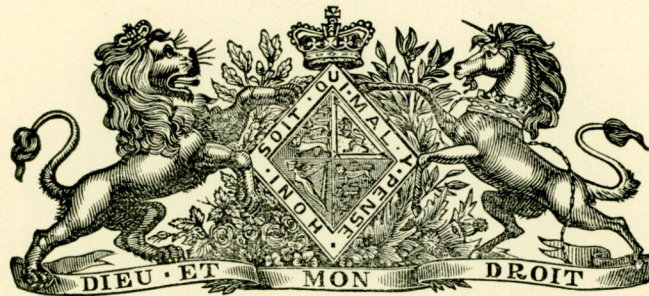

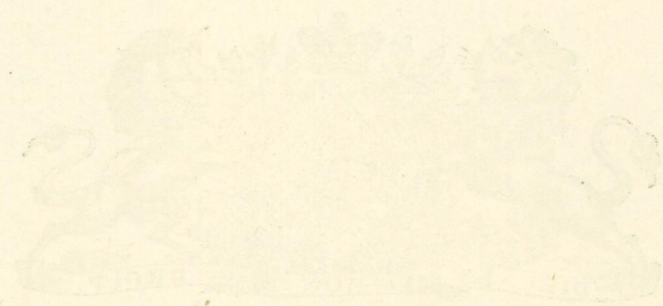

Patents and Stock Protection Act, 1888 shall include
rabbits.

Enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with
the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal,
the Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by
the authority of the Senate, as follows:—

1. The Act passed in the 51st year of Her Majesty Queen Victoria's
said Majesty, intituled "The Patents and Stock Protection Act,
(1888, No. 1800)"

2. The expression "noxious animals" in the Patents and Stock
Protection Act, 1888, shall include rabbits.

3. Nothing in this Act shall interfere with or derogate from any
provision of the Rabbit Act of 1889.
