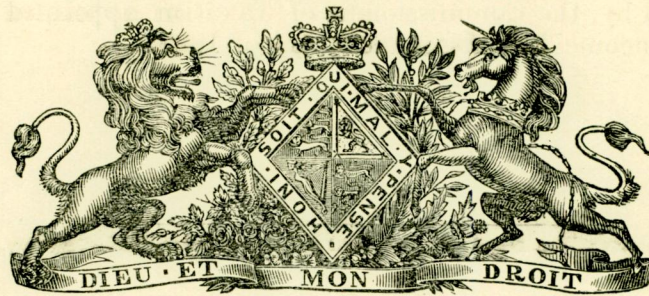

Short title.

1. This Act shall be construed with the Public Service Act of 1895 and Acts amending the same, and may be cited as the "Public Service (Taxation Officers) Act, 1900."

Appointment of persons temporarily employed by Commissioners of Taxation.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Public Service Act of 1895, the Governor, on the recommendation of the Board, may appoint as a permanent officer any person temporarily employed at the commencement of this Act in the office of, and recommended to be so appointed by, the Commissioners of Taxation appointed under the Land and Income Tax Assessment Act of 1895.

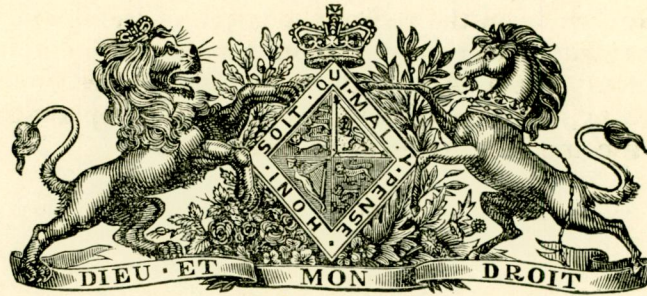

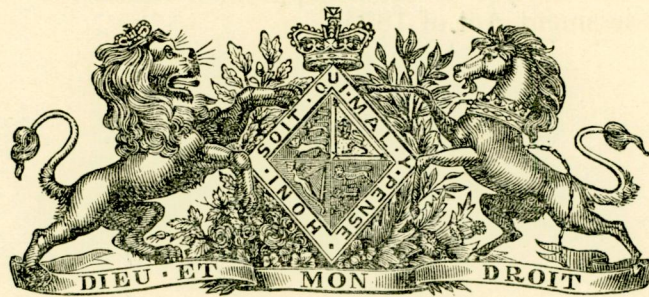
