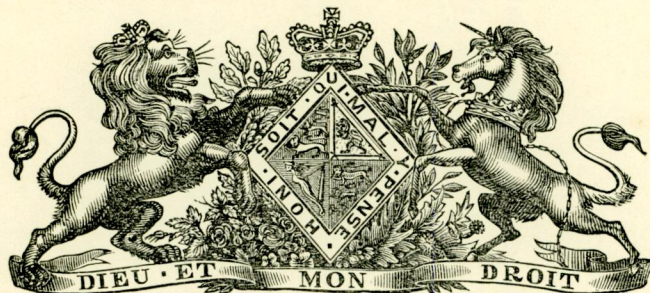

An Act to amend the Stamp Duties Act, 1898. [Assented to, 19th November, 1900.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. From and after the commencement of this Act postage stamps shall not be used for denoting the payment of duty under the provisions of the Stamp Duties Act, 1898. Postage stamps not to be used.

2. The Governor may by notice in the Gazette prescribe what forms of adhesive stamps may be used for the purpose of denoting the payment of duty under the provisions of the said Act. Governor to declare what stamps may be used.

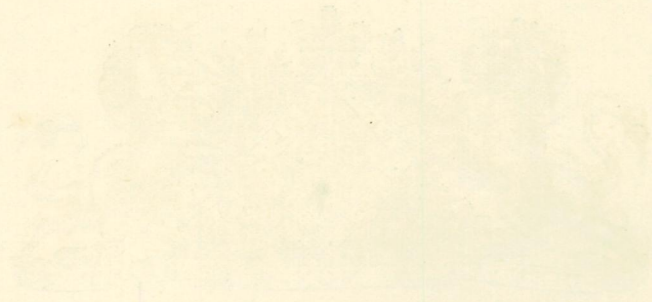
3. So much of section three of the said Act as includes postage stamp in the definition of "stamp" is hereby repealed. Repeal.

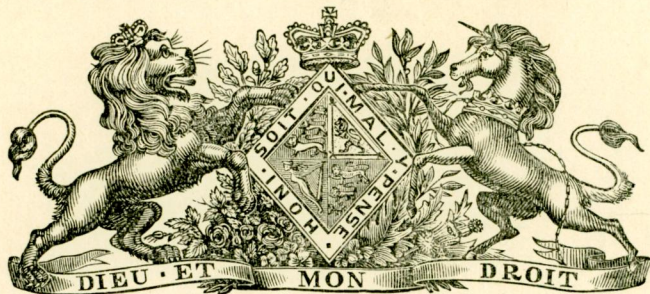

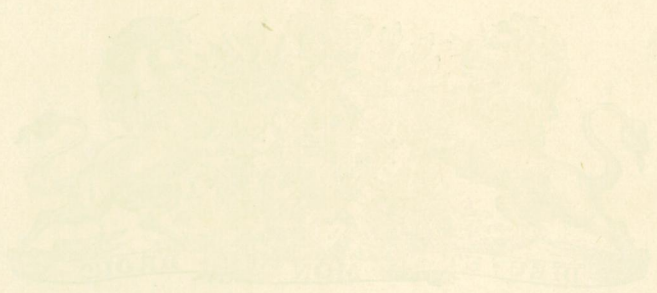

An Act to amend the Stamp Duties Act, 1898. [Assented to 19th November, 1900.]

Enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of New South Wales, that the Stamp Duties Act, 1898, be amended in the manner following:

1. From and after the commencement of this Act, the stamp duty shall not be used for levying the payment of duty on the proceeds of the Stamp Duties Act, 1898.

2. The Governor may by notice in the Gazette provide that forms of assize stamps may be used for the purpose of levying the payment of duty under the provisions of this Act.

3. The amount of a stamp duty on the sale of an estate or interest therein shall be the difference of the stamp duty on the purchase money and the stamp duty on the purchase price.

4. The Governor may by notice in the Gazette provide that the Stamp Duties Act, 1898, shall apply to the sale of an estate or interest therein.

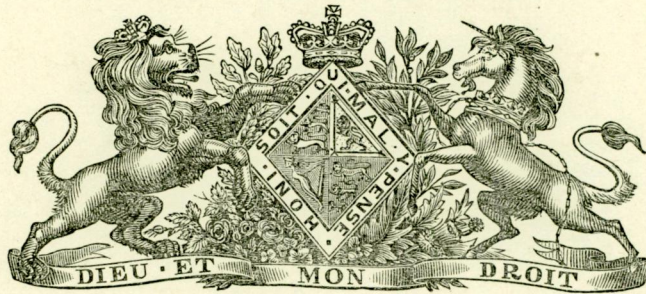

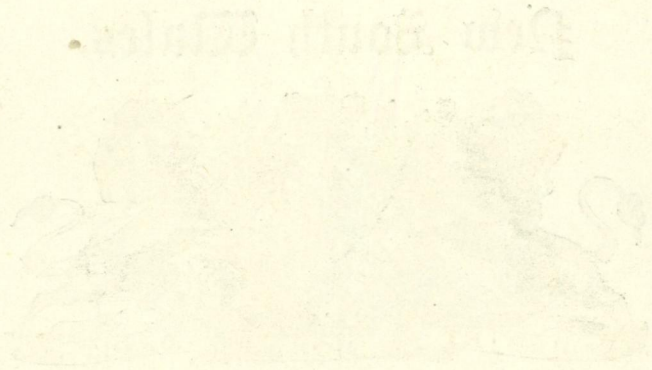
