Act No. 13, 1900.

An Act to amend The Rock to Green's Gunyah Railway Act, 1898, and the Public Works Act of 1888. [Assented to, 4th September, 1900.]

DE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section one hundred and Constructing six of the Public Works Act of 1888 the Constructing Authority of Authority need not the work described in the Schedule to The Rock to Green's Gunyah Railway Act, 1898, shall not be required or compelled nor shall it be the duty of the said authority to make or maintain any fence along the line of railway described in the said Schedule for the accommodation of any person or for any purpose whatsoever; but the said authority may in its discretion make and maintain such fences in connection with the said line of railway as it may think fit.

2. This Act shall be construed as one with The Rock to Green's Short title. Gunyah Railway Act, 1898, and may be cited as "The Rock to Green's Gunyah Railway (Amendment) Act, 1900."

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
