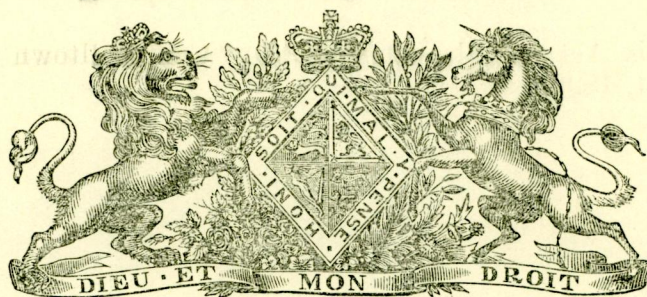

An Act to make provision for the election of a Mayor of the Municipality of Campbelltown. [Assented to, 22nd December, 1899.]

WHEREAS the office of Mayor of the Municipality of Campbelltown did on the twelfth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, become and now is vacant through the resignation of Edward Sedgwick, the former Mayor, and by reason of the lapse of certain meetings of the council of the said municipality the time provided by law within which a successor should be elected has expired: And whereas it is expedient that power should be given to the said Council to proceed to the election of a Mayor to supply the said vacancy: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty,

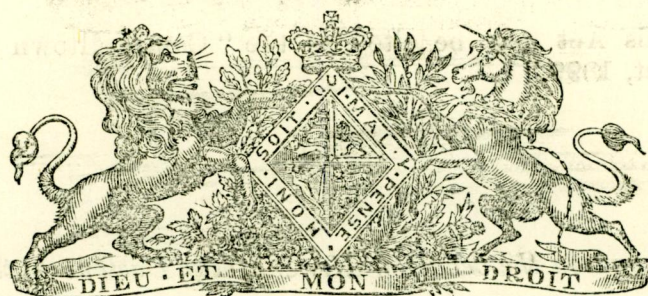

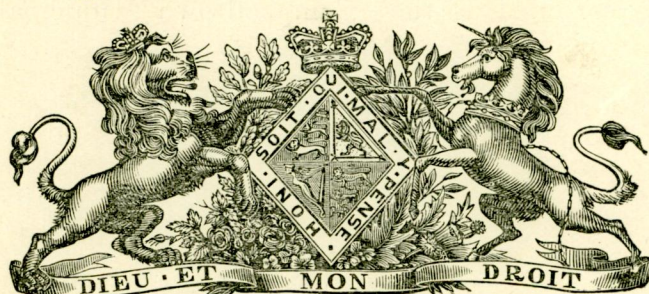
