An Act to amend the Advances to Settlers Act, 1899. [Assented to, 15th January, 1902.]

B^E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Advances to Settlers short title. (Amendment) Act, 1901."

2. (1) An advance may be made under section nine of the Amendments to Advances to Settlers Act, 1899, to the amount of five hundred pounds: section 9 of Advances and subsection (d) of that section is amended by substituting the words "five hundred pounds" for the words "two hundred pounds" in that subsection.

(2)

Advances to Settlers (Amendment).

(2) Subsection (g) of that section is repealed, and the following substituted in its place :---

"Every such advance, with interest thereon, shall be repaid within thirty-one years from the making of the advance, on a scale to be fixed by regulations made under this Act."

The word "temporary" in the first paragraph of the said section shall be omitted.




