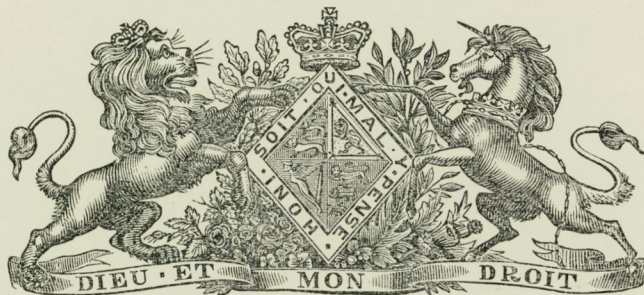

### Act No. 4, 1902.

An Act to make further provision with respect to the salary of one of the Railway Commissioners. [Assented to, 15th January, 1902.]

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Government Railways Short title.  
(Commissioner's Salary) Act, 1901."

2. Notwithstanding anything in the Government Railways Act, 1901, the Governor, by proclamation in the Gazette, may allot to one of the Railway Commissioners, at present in office under the authority of the said Act (not being the Chief Commissioner) any salary not exceeding two thousand pounds nor less than one thousand five hundred pounds per annum, in lieu of the salary provided by that Act; and upon such allotment being so made, such salary shall be charged on the Consolidated Revenue Fund, and such fund to the extent required for the payment of such salary shall be thereby appropriated.

Governor may allot salary to one of present Railway Commissioners.
