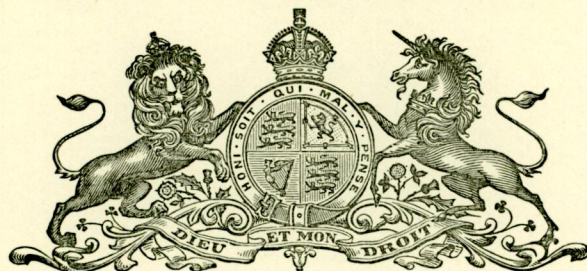

An Act to restrict and prohibit the use of tobacco, cigars, and cigarettes by juvenile members of the community.
[Assented to, 30th November, 1903.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. Any dealer in tobacco, cigars, or cigarettes, and any licensed tobacconist, or other person who supplies any person actually or apparently under the age of sixteen years with tobacco in any shape or form, cigars, or cigarettes, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five pounds.

Penalty on tobacconists or other persons for supplying juveniles with tobacco.

2. Fines imposed by this Act may be recovered before, and offences against this Act may be heard and determined by, any two justices in petty sessions or a police or stipendiary magistrate.

3. This Act may be cited as the "Juvenile Smoking Suppression Act of 1903."
