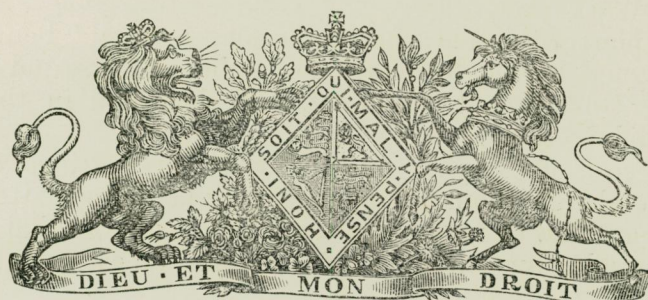

Act No. 12, 1902.

An Act to sanction and authorise the erection of a penitentiary and prison for females near Randwick; and for other purposes. [Assented to, 21st January, 1902.]

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of the Public Preamble.
Works Act, 1900, the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works did resolve that it was expedient to carry out a certain work, namely, the erection of a penitentiary and prison for females at Randwick, and did report their resolution to the Legislative Assembly: And whereas the said Assembly did, by resolution, declare that it was expedient that the said work should be carried out on a site near Randwick, more particularly referred to in the Schedule to this Act; and it is desirable that the said work should be carried out at the said site rather than at the site contemplated by the resolution of the said Committee:

Little Bay Penitentiary and Prison.

Committee: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Little Bay Penitentiary and Prison Act, 1901."

Work sanctioned.

2. The carrying out of the said work (more particularly described in the Schedule to this Act) is hereby sanctioned; and the Secretary for Public Works, or the member of the Executive Council for the time being performing the duties of the said Secretary, is hereby authorised to undertake and carry out the said work, subject to the provisions of this Act, and for that purpose shall be, and shall have the powers and duties of, a Constructing Authority, within the meaning of the Public Works Act, 1900.

Plan of work.

3. The plan of the said work is the plan marked "Penitentiary, Randwick," signed by the Secretary for Public Works, and countersigned by the Government Architect, and deposited in the public office of the said Secretary.

Cost, how to be defrayed.

4. The cost of carrying out the said work, estimated at one hundred and eighteen thousand pounds, may be defrayed from such Loan Votes as are now or may hereafter be applicable to that purpose, and shall not under any circumstances exceed the estimated cost by more than ten per centum.

SCHEDULE.

The erection of buildings, &c., as follows, on a site adjoining the tramway to La Perouse, to the south-west boundary of the village of Brand, and situated near Little Bay, parish of Botany, county of Cumberland:—

Female prison.
Male penitentiary.
Governor's residence.

Twelve warders' cottages.
Fencing site.
Electric lighting and plant.
Laundry plant (both buildings).
Steam-cooking and hot water service (both buildings).

Subject to such alterations as may be deemed necessary during the progress of the works.
