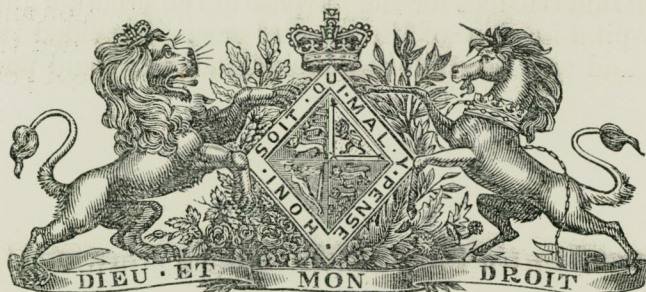

### Act No. 52, 1901.

An Act to enable the Committee of the Maitland Hospital to apply certain moneys for the purpose of the erection and furnishing of a new hospital. [Assented to, 26th November, 1901.]

**W**HEREAS it has been resolved by the committee of the Maitland Hospital Preamble. that it is desirable to erect and furnish a new hospital in place of the present one, and it is deemed necessary to obtain legislative authority to apply the funds of the hospital for that purpose: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Maitland Hospital Enabling Act, 1901." Short title.

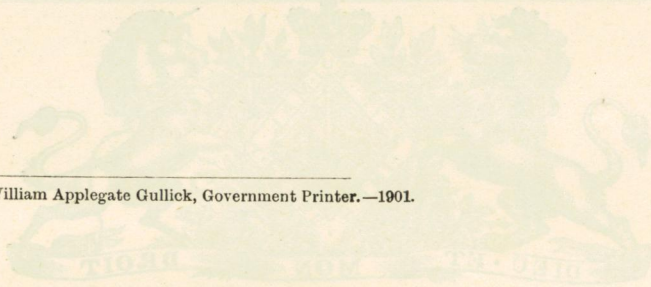
