An Act to consolidate the enactments relating to the closing of butchers' shops on Sundays. [Assented to, 26th August, 1902.]

**B**<sup>E</sup> it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :---

1. This Act may be cited as the "Butchers' Shops Sunday Closing Act, 1902."

2. The Act forty-seventh Victoria number eight is hereby repealed.

**3.** (1) No person within the metropolitan police district Butchers' shops exercising, or employed in the trade or calling of, or acting with the within metropolitan privity or consent of a butcher, shall keep open, or allow to be kept be open on Sunday. open, his shop or premises for the sale of meat, or sell or expose for sale 47 Vic. No. 8, s. 1. any meat, at such shop or premises between the hours of twelve on Saturday night and twelve on Sunday night.

(2) Any person offending against this Act shall, on conviction Penalty. of any such offence before the nearest court of petty sessions within seven days from the commission thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding three pounds, nor less than twenty shillings.






