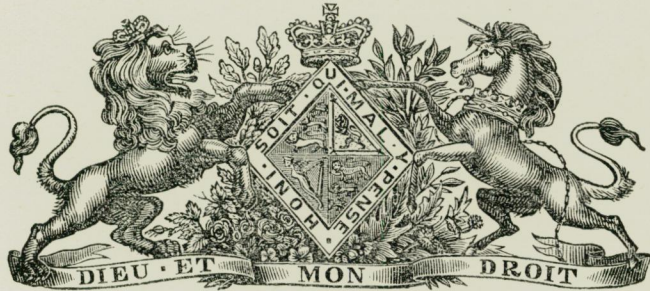

An Act to amend the law relating to the holding of offices in case of the demise of the Crown. [Assented to, 10th December, 1901.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Demise of the Crown Act, Short title. 1901."

2. (1) The holding of any office under the Crown shall not be affected nor shall any fresh appointment thereto be rendered necessary by the demise of the Crown. Effect of demise of the Crown on holding of office.

(2) It shall not be necessary for the holder of any office under the Crown who before such demise has taken any oath prescribed or provided for in any Statute to again take such oath after such demise; but where any such oath relates only to the then reigning Sovereign, it shall be deemed to relate to such Sovereign, Her or His Heirs and Successors, according to law.

(3) This Act shall take effect as from the last demise of the Crown.

(3) This Act shall take effect as from the last demise of the Crown.

An Act to amend the law relating to the holding of offices in case of the demise of the Crown.

Enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Demesne of the Crown Act, 1901."

2. The provisions of any Act passed by the Legislature of New South Wales which relate to the holding of offices in case of the demise of the Crown shall be deemed to have been amended so as to conform to the provisions of this Act.

3. It shall not be necessary for the holder of any office under the Crown who holds such office by virtue of a commission or appointment made by the Governor in Council to be sworn or take any oath or qualification, and where any such office is held by a person who is not a subject of the Queen, he shall be deemed to have taken such oath or qualification as if he were a subject of the Queen.

4. The provisions of this Act shall not apply to any office of honor or to any office which is not a substantive office.

AN ACT to amend the law relating to the holding of office in
case of the absence of the Governor.

Enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with
the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal,
in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same,
as follows:—

1. The Governor of the Colony of New South Wales, in the absence of the Governor, shall be held to be the Governor for all purposes of the law, and shall exercise the powers and perform the duties of the Governor in that behalf.

2. The holding of any office under the Crown shall not be affected by the absence of the Governor, and any appointment or removal of any person to or from any such office shall be validly made by the Governor in the absence of the Governor.
