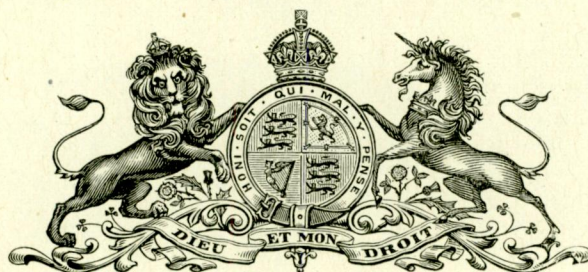

Act No. 1903.

An Act to authorize the appointment of a Public Officer,
to be known as the Public Officer.

1. It is enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales, that the Public Officer shall be appointed by the Governor, and shall hold office for a term of years, not exceeding five, and shall be eligible for re-appointment.

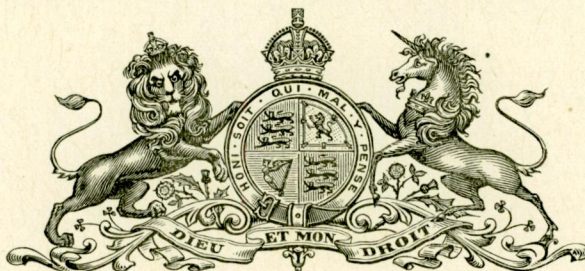
